

NEW WATER SYSTEM FOR CITY GLENDALE IS NOW COMPLETED

(News-Review Douglas County Special)

GLENDALE, April 24—Work of rebuilding Glendale's water distribution system by D. P. Slater, contractor, was completed Tuesday evening. The work on this project was begun about four weeks ago. It is a part of Glendale's program of rebuilding the municipal water distribution system, making extensions and increasing the source of water supply for which a \$15,000 bond issue was authorized by a special election held February 10.

The improvements just completed by Slater, contractor, include relaying about 5719 feet of four-inch pipe on Montgomery, Willis and Gilbertson avenues and connecting streets, laying about 2290 feet of six-inch pipe on South Street and along Pacific avenue; and laying about 374 feet of eight-inch and 377 feet of ten-inch from the reservoir and down the hill. The new six-inch pipe along Pacific avenue replaces the former four-inch pipe along this street and also permitted the installation of larger fire hydrants here. Twenty-one fire hydrants were moved and reset, including several new hydrants added to the system. Nearly 115 new service connections were made, mostly one-half inch; valves were installed on all the lines so that repairs can be made to any line without discommodating water users on other lines; and five blowouts were installed to facilitate flushing the water mains.

The exact figure as to cost of this job is not available yet, according to J. Elmer Nelson, city engineer under whose supervision the work was done, but he estimated it will be approximately \$10,000. This includes money paid to Slater for labor and material, additional fire hydrants and material, extra work and supervising costs.

INJUNCTION HALTS PORTLAND'S DEAL WITH RATE FIRM

PORTLAND, Ore., April 24—A temporary injunction restraining city council, Mayor Baker, City Auditor Paik and others from entering into a contract with Carey and Harlan company, rate experts, and from paying them an inventory fee was signed yesterday by Circuit Judge Stevenson.

The firm was to have been employed in connection with the street railway system and the service at cost plan inaugurated by Carey and Harlan.

The city council today directed H. C. Atwell, chief of the bureau of carrying control, to avoid where ever possible the placing of liens on property for failure to halt for earwigs.

It was indicated the council would not finance any campaign to eradicate the earwigs.

Considerable protest has been heard here over the plans for the city placing liens on property owners who failed to take measures to kill earwigs.
