HAZARDS OF FIRE
TOLD TO LIONS BY
CHIEF FLETCHER

Roseburg Lions know more about fire hazards and losses today than they did yesterday. This is not because they had any experience with fire during the past twenty-four hours, but because Fire Chief James Fletcher told the club members a lot of things about the subject at their dinner meeting last night.

The fireman pointed out some of the common hazards which are responsible for fires, placing defective fuses at the head of the list. Overloading electrical wiring and the use of pennies behind fuse plugs were also named as common fire causes. Use of gasoline to clean chamois gloves or silk cases many fatalities throughout the country, the chief said. Another danger is spontaneous combustion, a common evidence of which is the careless disposal of rags used to fast furniture and floors. Mr. Fletcher pointed out, giving illustrations.

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FREBERG DEFEATS
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OTHER BOUT EVEN

PORTLAND, Ore., April 24.—John Freberg, Minneapolis heavyweight wrestler, defeated Howard Cantonwine, Iowa, two out of three falls, and Dr. Karl Sarpollis, Cleveland, and Pat McGill, Irish contender, wrestled to a draw after each wrestler had taken one fall. In a double main event here last night, Cantonwine flipped Freberg for the first fall in two minutes 20 seconds when he snapped on a reverse double wristlock. Freberg evened the count in 18 minutes 30 seconds when he picked Cantonwine up with a crotch hold and slammed him to the mat. After about five minutes' wrestling in the final round, Freberg sidestepped one of Cantonwine's rushes, the latter falling to the floor with Freberg on top.

Sarpollis and McGill wrestled six ten-minute rounds. McGill took the first fall in one minute 45 seconds with an airplane spin. Sarpollis won the second fall with a flying body scissors.
