to enter the White city and rescue the men.

Outbreak Follows Calm
The shooting followed a night and morning of comparative quiet within the prison walls. A half hour after the guards had sent bullets streaming into the tile-house holes, the convicts had quieted down, and prison officials ordered guards into the cells to make an inspection.

The break for liberty came shortly after national guardsmen started erection of a barbed wire stockade in the prison ward, in which it was proposed to hold the revolvers until the hundreds of cell locks had been repaired. The mutineers heretofore had continued their activities of "passive resistance" against the wardenship of Preston E. Thomas. They had been in revolt since the fire a week ago
