

FAMOUS ORATORIO BY HAYDEN TO BE HEARD IN EUGENE

An outstanding musical event for all of western Oregon is to occur in Eugene on Friday evening, May 16, in the presentation of "The oratorio," famous oratorio by Hayden, by the Eugene Oratorio society and visiting artists.

The society chorus of 315 voices and the University of Oregon orchestra of 50 pieces will be featured in the concert. The director will be John Stark Evans, of the University music faculty. Mr. Evans is director of the Umpqua post, American Legion, place club of Roseburg.

Three distinguished singers have

been engaged to take the solo roles. Arthur Boardman will be tenor soloist with the Portland Symphony orchestra and the Portland choral society in Handel's "Messiah" in Portland last winter, and had the tenor lead in the Eugene society's concert a year ago.

Ruth Somerindyke, soprano, of Los Angeles, and Lester Spring, bass, of Chicago, will come to Eugene to take the other solo parts. Both are known throughout the country as oratorio singers of first rank.

The concert is to be given in McArthur court. The acoustical qualities of the court have been improved by the construction of a sound shell over the concert stage and the hanging of a false ceiling of cloth to prevent echoes.
