A FLOWER FROM A ROSEBURG GARDEN

Miss Daphne Hughes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Washington Hughes of this city, recently elected president of the national assembly of the Young Women's Christian association, is the first Oregon girl to ever achieve this honor and the second from the west to be chosen as national president of the organization.

By her election, Miss Hughes becomes head of the national student assembly and chairman of the executive group of the national student council. She will preside over the national convention of the Y. W. C. A. representatives to convene again in two years, and the executive group of the council which meets in Chicago in September.

Miss Hughes is a junior at the University of Oregon and is a graduate of the Roseburg high school, where she was very prominent in student activities. She has been interested for many years in girls' work and has been serving for the past year as president of the Older Girls' conference for the state of Oregon. She presided over the annual conference held in Salem April 4, 5 and 6, and then left for Detroit, Michigan, as a delegate from the Eugene chapter, Y. W. C. A. to attend the national convention, where she was given the highest honor of that assembly.

Over four thousand delegates were present for the Detroit meeting. Miss Hughes was a member of the executive committee and gave one of the principal addresses.

Miss Hughes is also president of the Geneva Glen (Colorado) conference for Older Girls. This organization is composed of 41 Protestant denominations, and delegates are sent from all parts of the country to Geneva Glen, near Denver, for an annual conference—The Roseburg News-Review, May 2, 1929.
