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## CANVASS OF VOTE AT PRIMARY SHOWS LITTLE VARIATION

The official count on Friday's primary election, made today, showed very little variation from the unofficial report compiled by the News-Review and respective stands were not materially affected in any way. The compilation of election returns in Douglas county on the night of election is a very difficult task, as reports are telephoned in over remote lines, and often under adverse circumstances, so that an unofficial count offers many hard problems. The primary election this year was handled by the News-Review in record time, the complete count being reported just 23 hours after the polls closed, and the final count shows very little change from the figures as announced.

The final count was made by C. F. Sowersby of Riddle and James Dearing of Oakland, assisted by Vernita Kohlhaugen and Helen Leake of the county clerk's office.

The vote on the North Umpqua road was exactly as reported by the news-Review—1510 yes and 332 no.

The tabulation of precinct and district officers has not yet been completed.
