

ROSEBURG FREIGHT RATES HIGHEST IN WESTERN OREGON

Roseburg has the highest freight rates of any city in the western part of Oregon, according to figures compiled by the Eugene chamber of commerce as a step in securing a more equitable adjustment of rates for this section of the state. This condition, which has been in existence for many years, was recently attacked by the Western traffic association, which was organized at Roseburg two years ago, with 14 Oregon cities affiliated, and adjustments were secured on some commodities, but the general status of rates remains unchanged.

Roseburg is paying the highest rates in this region, her figure being \$1.73 1/2 per 100 pounds, or 141 per cent of the port rate. Medford is next high with \$1.60 hundred-weight, 123 per cent above the port rate, while Cottage Grove is third with \$1.48 a hundred-weight, 106 per cent higher than the port rate. Eugene is fourth.

Oregon City pays a first class freight rate of 24 1/2 cents a hundred-weight, 32 per cent higher than the port rate, while Richmond, Cal., which is also 15 miles from its port, pays only 70 cents a hundred-weight, a figure only 10 per cent higher than the port rate.

A table of rates which show those for Oregon cities and for California cities at comparably the same distances from ports, is given below:

TYPHOID DEATH FAULT OF TOILER, HIGH COURT SAYS

(Associated Press Leased Wire) SALEM, Ore., May 20.—Typhoid fever contracted from drinking untreated water when treated water was furnished by the employing company was not an accident, says the supreme court. Therefore Alberta Blair, whose husband, Horace Newton Blair, died from typhoid as a result of drinking Rogue river water, cannot get compensation from the state industrial accident commission.

The court made this decision today, reversing Judge Percy R. Kelly of the circuit court for Marion county.

Blair was employed by O. N. Pierce & Co. in the construction of a bridge across Rogue river at Gold Hill. Although the company had arranged for the workmen to get treated water three of them preferred to drink from a hose that brought water directly from the river. All three became ill with typhoid and Blair died.

SCIENCE TACKLES "DON'T CARE" GERM OF RAIL WORKERS

(Associated Press Leased Wire) CHICAGO, May 20.—The task of curing "what's-the-use" feeling that impairs the efficiency of the Illinois Central railroad, has been undertaken by Dr. James H. Hutton, endocrinologist.

Dr. Hutton, who assumed his duties yesterday, is believed by the railroad to be the first to apply endocrinology to industry. He believes the efficiency of employees will be increased by the scientific treatment of thyroid, adrenal, pituitary and other glands.

"We want all these 60,000 employees hitting on all six cylinders," Dr. Hutton explained. "My job is to remove the carbon—to treat the glands that cause sickness and low efficiency."

Neurasthenia—that "what's-the-use feeling"—that limits a man's working power, he believes, can be cured by gland treatment.

CANTERBURY ARCHBISHOP SAID SERIOUSLY ILL

(Associated Press Leased Wire) LONDON, May 20.—Serious illness of Archbishop Lord Davidson, recently archbishop of Canterbury, is causing some anxiety.

The present archbishop of Canterbury, preaching at Southwark cathedral yesterday, referred to the aged prelate as lying "in bed not so much of sickness as of weakness, where with quiet fortitude and patience he is awaiting the call to rest."
