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## PETITIONS SEEK TO OUST ROSEBURG SCHOOL DIRECTORS

Petitions seeking the recall of B. R. Shoemaker and G. C. Finlay as school directors were filed with Mrs. A. J. Geddes, school clerk, today. The petitions have been in circulation for several weeks, resulting from the last petition in dismissing D. E. Oleman as principal of the junior high school.

The petitions ask that each of the directors be recalled for the reasons, "That for personal and political reasons, for the gratification of his own animosity and the advancement of his own political fortunes, and against the overwhelming expressed remonstrance of the parents of school children in the above school district, and without other sufficient reason, and against the best interests and welfare of the school in said district, he did refuse to hire the best and most capable and best teacher available as principal of the junior high school in said district."

The school board this year refused to renew Mr. Oleman's contract, employing a new instructor, employing a new instructor to fill his place for next year.

While this action was taken by the entire board, the recall petitions are aimed at Directors Shoemaker and Finlay, as they have the longest terms to serve, having been elected at the last school election. Britt Nichols, present chairman, and V. T. Jackson, are retiring directors this year, so that the filing of the recall petition will make four places to be considered, and will give those opposing the board an opportunity to gain full control if sufficient strength can be mustered for the candidates.

The petitions do not name candidates against the contested directors who automatically go upon the recall ballot. It is expected, however, that a ticket will be filed naming directors for the vacancies that will arise by the expiration of the terms of Nichols and Jackson, and also to oppose Shoemaker and Finlay. Petitions may be filed until seven days before election.

The matter of recall will come to a vote at the annual school election, June 16.

The petitions filed today bear 217 names. They were circulated by Clarence A. Miller, F. A. Greenlaw, Mrs. H. F. Hatfield, Mrs. Flossie Virden, Macon G. Smith and B. F. Doss.
