DEPOSIT BOXES ARE ROBBED OF \$512,000

ST. LOUIS, May 28.—Known losses in the looting of the safe deposit vault of the Grand National bank here Sunday leaped to \$512,000 today when the National Indemnity Exchange Insurance company reported its loss in negotiable securities.

Losses in bonds, jewelry, cash and other valuables previously reported by customer victims, had approximated \$280,000. Of this amount more than \$200,000 was in negotiable bonds and \$20,000 represented cash taken from three tellers' boxes.

The burglary was committed by three to five robbers who broke open 33 deposit boxes in the vault which was being dismantled preparatory to being moved to a new location.

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
