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THREE BALL GAMES DATED FOR FINLAY FIELD SATURDAY

Baseball fans of the county will be given an opportunity Saturday to see some snappy baseball. There are to be three games played on Finlay field. At 10 o'clock Saturday morning the north section of the county using players from Yoncalla, Oakland and Sutherlin will play the central section which is using players from Roseburg and Glide in a seven-inning game. At 1 o'clock the south section of the county using players from Glendale, Riddle and Myrtle Creek will meet the central section and then at 2:45 the south section will play the north section. Each team will play two seven-inning games in competition for the county championship.

Beginning April 12 the south end of the county played off a schedule which has just ended with Myrtle Creek as winner. The committee in charge of the south end is composed of Rudolph Ritzman, Roseburg, of the general committee; E. R. Harvey, Glendale; C. T. Wilde, Riddle, and T. H. Ireland, Myrtle Creek.

The north end of the county began their schedule on April 19. This schedule has been completed, but the winner has not been reported. This section has been in charge of H. H. Turner and B. E. Larson, Roseburg, of the general committee; L. V. Hogg, Oakland; Avery Lasswell, Yoncalla, and G. F. Grunich, Sutherlin. The central section has been handled entirely by A. V. Cacy of the general committee.

Each section is confident of winning the county championship and is ready to put up a good scrap toward that end. While these games are being played Saturday a group of men versed in baseball will select a squad of players to represent the county against teams of other counties of the state. It is hoped to have some able coaches spend some time with these boys so that they cannot only win the district championship, but go on through for the state championship and then step out for the regional and national championship.
