ROAD FROM BANDON TO COQUILLE TO BE OILED THIS SUMMER

BANDON, June 4.—The resurfacing of the Coquille-Bandon highway has been under way for some time. The road is being repaired and graded with gravel and is to be oiled later after the rock has packed sufficiently.

The highway is continually scraped and rolled to help pack it so that the oil can be poured, thus making a hard smooth surface road. The work was started a little late in the year for the convenience of the tourists but the construction is being rushed. This will make a wonderful road available for the much travel which is expected during the coming summer months.

The gravel is put on in large quantities, then smoothed out and dirt distributed so as to cover the gravel. This aids in the packing of the surface. Another coat of rock is then to be scattered on the road, then the oil is sprayed on and a thin coat of crushed rock to make a fine macadam road.
