IN the early days of summer we all look forward to walking in the fields and woods seeking wild flowers. Among the friendly flowers and plants, there is one that is a positive enemy to men. This is "poison ivy," so-called. Its scientific name is "Rhus Toxicodendron."

"Poison Ivy Week." You should not be ignorant of the identity of the plant, it will save you much suffering if you are sure to avoid contact with it. It has a bright green, glossy leaf and is made up of leaves in groups of three, or, as the botanist will tell you, it is "trifoliate." The stem of the middle leaf is always longer and two or three times larger than the stems of the other two leaves.

One effective method suggested for exterminating this ivy is to spray it out by the roots. But, as has been suggested, this is dangerous for the rubber unless great care is taken.

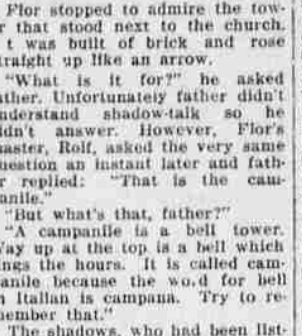

FARMERS SHOULD USE MORE BUTTER, EXPERT ADVISES

Chairman Oregon Dairy Products Campaign Committee. There are, of course, no statistics which give the per capita consumption of butter in cities as contrasted with rural districts...

The expected improvement in industry conditions has not materialized. It seems evident that industrial and commercial conditions will show no substantial advance next year.

The current make of butter is slightly less than it was last year, but on the other hand, there is a great lack of confidence in the storage situation.

Fortunately, the present excess of supplies is so small that the situation can continue to remain under the control of the farmers themselves.
