TODAY'S MARKETS

PORTLAND, June 7—Butter has advanced and eggs have declined. With the market top-heavy from accumulated supplies, the Pacific Cooperative Egg Producers association announced a 2c reduction in egg quotations late Friday. This decrease extends to 2c above standard to 2c and mediums to 2c.

The produce exchange added 1c to the price of butter, making extra, 25c; standards 22c; prime extras, 21c and firsts 20c.

Butter at the same time was advanced 1c to 21c delivered Portland.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation the Portland bureau of the U. S. department of agricultural survey.

"Strawberry receipts are liberal again, but most of Wednesday's supply were either spoiled or trucked to Seattle. The Seattle berry market is decidedly stronger than at Portland. As a result of recent rains, strawberries are still too watery to stand longer than overnight without securing Montana orders shipped that far, until berries show better quality. Growers at Portland and Tugay Sound points are now at the height of the season's activity.

Trade demand for Oregon peas— from Montana and Oregon peas— is strong, and the market is firm for good peas. Present crop shipments are strictly U. S. No. 1 quality; consequently, peas offered for sale locally are generally of inferior quality, but still of good quality.

Prices continue to advance, at irregular intervals. Larger sizes shifted upward in price this week again.

"All-fifth berries and apricots have been available for several weeks, although at strictly luxury prices.

Local new potatoes are on the market in small quantities. They are in potatoes and fruit stands have had local potatoes for a week or so.
