

STATE UNIVERSITY GRADS INCLUDE 10 FROM THIS COUNTY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Ore., June 12.—(Special to News-Review.)—Ten of the 577 students at the University of Oregon who form the largest graduating class in the history of any institution in the state are from Douglas county. 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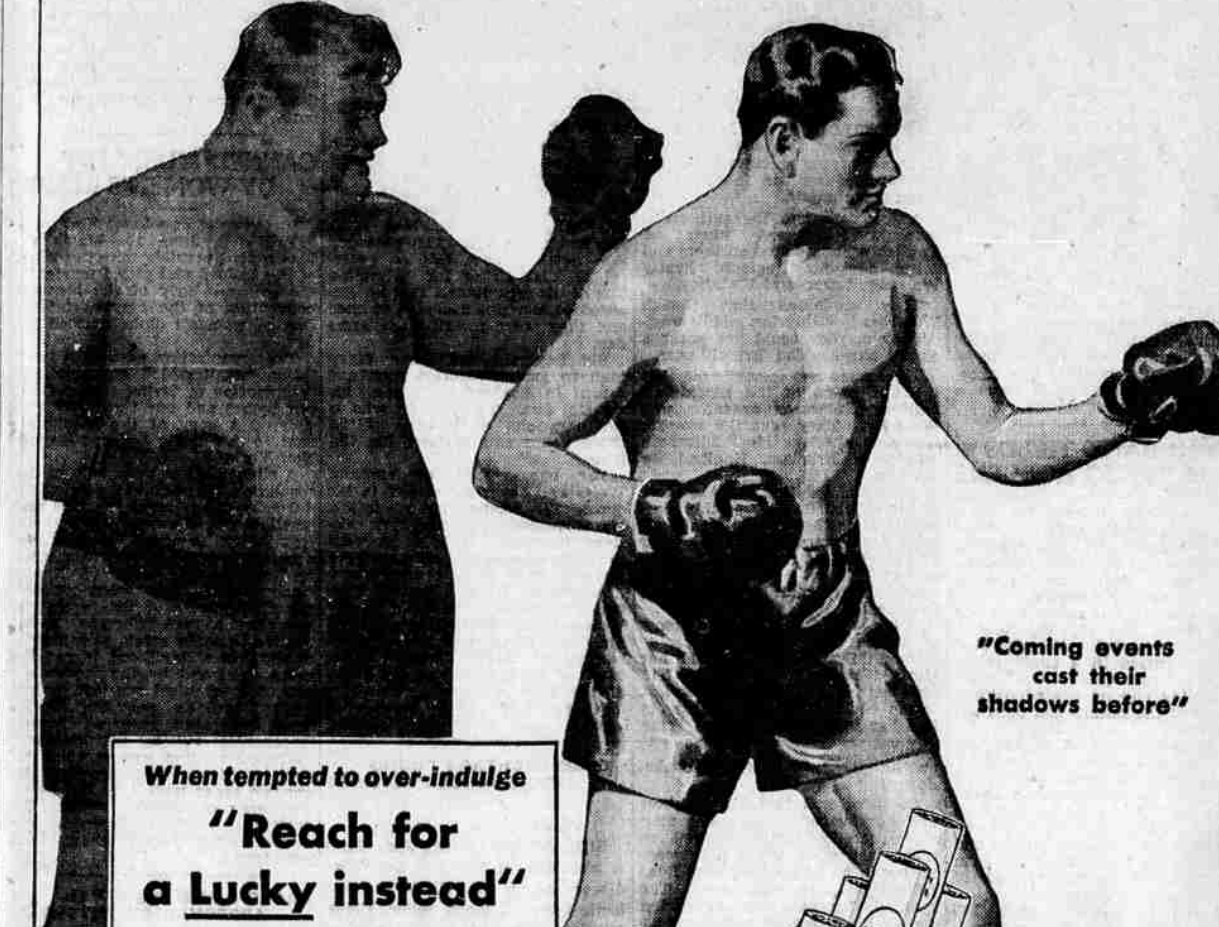

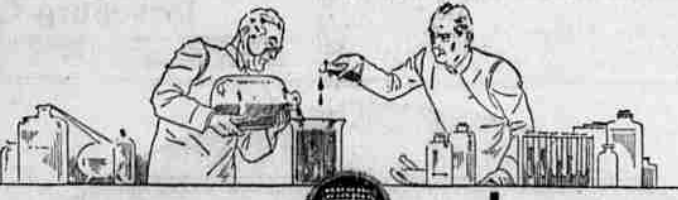
