TURKEY TATTOOING DEMONSTRATED AT DOUGLAS RANCHES

At two well attended meetings held yesterday at the O. C. Brown farm at Dixonville, and the J. H. Carnes farm at Carnes station, south of Roseburg, J. C. Leedy, county agent, demonstrated the recently used in tattooing turkeys and other poultry.

According to Mr. Leedy, the system is comparatively simple and may easily be learned by the average grower, consisting of tattooing designated brands made up of a series of needle points into the web of the wing of the bird, and later massaging the openings made by the needle points with a dark colored, non-poisonous ink, which leaves a permanent impression.

To date, the numbers from one to seventy-five have been assigned to poultrymen of the county. These numbers, preceded by the letter "D" in Douglas county, make up the brand which when registered with the state veterinarian gives the grower exclusive use of the mark in Oregon, and is recognized as prima facie evidence of ownership in the courts.

The system of branding where used has materially reduced the losses of poultry by theft. It also has the advantage of enabling owners to identify turkeys at killing time, as shown by the experience of Joe Kuntah of the South Deer creek section, whose neighbors found in their flocks and returned to Mr. Kuntah seven of his turkeys, bearing his brand, during the past winter when the turkeys were rounded up for killing.
