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'THE TEXAN' BIG OUTDOOR PICTURE STARRING COOPER

GARY COOPER has become a star in his own right since making "The Virginian." Now he is back in the companion picture to "The Virginian," "The Texan," which opens its three days run at the Antlers theatre tonight. Cooper's rugged form and natural western tang give a realism and stirring naturalness to these gripping outdoor taking specials which have a strong appeal.

"The Texan" is fast-moving, absorbing and bristling with melodramatic action. It opens at a gallop, on the sun-baked plains of Texas, with Cooper dodging the law. It moves swiftly into tense situations as, in self-defense, he shoots a crooked gambler and once more flees an angry justice. It breathes suspense and thrills, as Cooper stumbles into the most glamorous adventure of his daredevil career; poses as the son of a wealthy South American widow; falls in love with her beautiful niece; finds he is too wholehearted to carry out his sinister plans against the old lady, and fights to preserve his "good" reputation.

There's not a dull moment in "The Texan." Gary Wray, Cooper's lovely sweetheart in "The First Kiss" and his great war drama, "The Condemned," is gorgeous as the South American heiress who captures the fickle heart of the swaggering Texas bandit. Emma Dunn, for nearly a quarter of a century famous for her mother roles on stage and screen, gives the most appealing mother characterization the movies have produced in some time. And the supporting cast is composed of thoroughly capable and delightful type characters.

"Little Johnny Jones," an elaborate production of the famous George M. Cohan stage hit, comes to the Liberty Theatre Friday with Eddie Buzzell in the title role as the Yankee Doodle Jockey. Albee Day opposite him as the heroine, and a large cast of film favorites in support.

The story in the modern screen version packs a triple punch. Its greatest thrills come in three big horse races, the last being at the world-famous English Derby, and they provide plenty of gasps throughout the picture. Buzzell's comedy, famous on Broadway keeps the spectator laughing; and the love story is said to be charming and unusual.
