LEARNING BY EXPERIENCE

With the close of its third year the experimental college of the University of Wisconsin has made definite progress and will start its fourth year in an attempt to discover more efficient teaching methods.

Dr. Alexander Meiklejohn, head of the educational research plant, announced:

This definitely sets at rest reports that the experimental college would be abolished. Dr. Glenn Frank, president of the university, recently said that if he had a son in college he would prefer to have him in the experimental group.

Dr. Meiklejohn points out that the cost of teaching was \$19 more per student in the experimental college than in the general courses but he contends that this does not mean that the tutorial system is necessarily more expensive. His statement bears out the contention of other faculty members that the proposed adoption of a new curriculum for the college of letters and sciences will in no way disturb experimental activities.

"The dominant purpose throughout," Dr. Meiklejohn said, "is to increase the student's individual power to use books for the development of his own intelligence. Most characteristic of the tutorial system is the personal relationship between the teacher and pupil. We are becoming more and more strongly convinced of the value and necessity of this kind of teaching."

Laboratory work in physics was introduced to the experimental college last fall and Dr. Meiklejohn said that it proved "very promising." Next year courses in biology and anthropology will be introduced as a basis for the studies in human activities. —News story June 1930.
