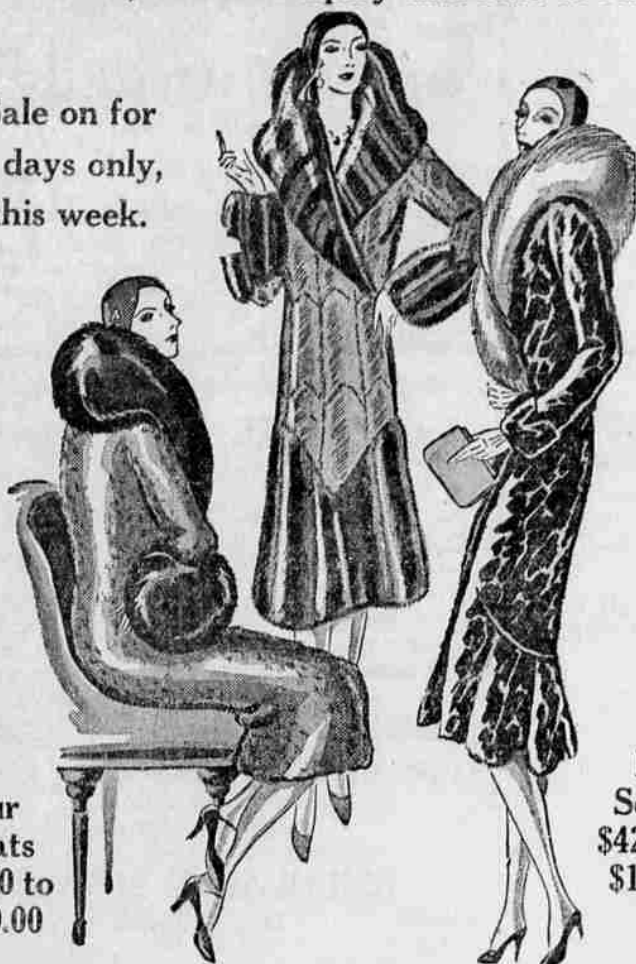

DYER'S CASH STORE AT GLENDALE TO HAVE NEW BUILDING

GLENDALE, July 22.—Construction work on a new business building which when completed will be the new home of Dyer's Cash Store was begun here yesterday under the supervision of Lee Williams of Roseburg, foreman for L. W. Metzger, a Roseburg contractor.

The site for the new building is at the southwest corner of Pacific avenue and Third street, one of the choicest business locations in the city, with 20 foot frontage on Pacific avenue.

The building will be one story, 20 by 70 feet, with concrete floor and front wall and with side walls of built up the construction. Partitions will separate the store room from a warehouse and temporary living quarters in the back. Work is to be rushed and it is expected to have the building completed within 30 days.

Dyer's Cash Store, specializing in groceries, is now located in the Bessel building on Gilbertson avenue, where this business has been conducted by its present owners, Mr. and Mrs. George C. Dyer, since August, when Dyer bought out his former partner, C. L. Kusler of Myrtle Creek, who started this store about 18 months ago.
