THE GRIT THAT WINS

When Leo F. Caldwell of Arlington receives his bachelor of business administration from Boston university on June 16 he will have completed eighteen consecutive years of evening school attendance. What is more his commencement this spring does not mark the end of that period, for he has completed arrangements with the college registrar to work for his master's degree, which will take at least three more years of evening college attendance.

"After that," Mr. Caldwell says, "I don't know just what I shall do, but I have no intention of terminating my academic work."

After several years of evening work, he received his LL. B. degree from the Suffolk school in 1924, celebrating in that year his twenty-seventh birthday by getting married and being admitted to the bar.

Since then he has practiced law in Boston.

His business career goes back to the time when, still a boy in shorts in grammar school, he worked as a errand runner for a Harvard Square bakery and candy store. After leaving business college in 1912, he worked as an office clerk for the Ward Baking company, going as office boy in the following year to the Hood Rubber company in Watertown. This was in the accounting department.

Five years later the former office boy became an assistant to the outward traffic manager of the same company. Soon after this promotion, Caldwell left the Hood Rubber company and went to work with the Gillette Safety Razor company as a helper in the shipping department, later attaining the position of traffic manager. All this time he attended school at night and in scholastic records was found always near the head of his class.

Since his admission to the Massachusetts bar he has been promoted to the legal department of the Gillette company and has his own office.

While working as an office boy Caldwell once heard a business executive remark that the average business man knows little about law and that the average lawyer is a poor business man. This chance statement determined the youth on what has turned out to be his unique educational career.—The New York Times, May 18, 1930.

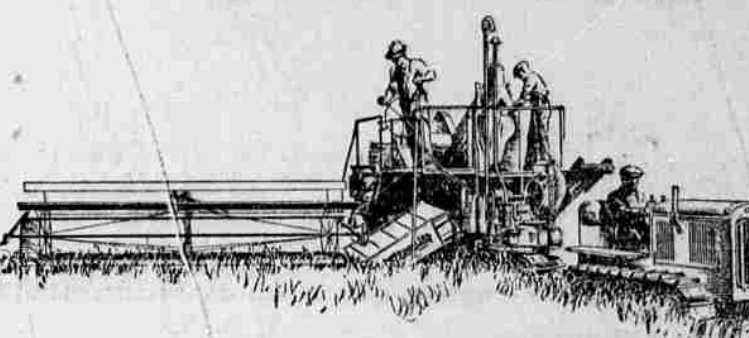
