AL LASSMAN DIED IN RESCUER ROLE, INQUIRY REVEALS

NEW YORK, Aug. 1.—New York university officials, in a statement published today, gave an entirely new version of the death, by drowning, of Al Lassman, football star in Long Lake, Maine, on July 6.

Contrary to previously published facts in the case, university authorities asserted an investigation conducted by university representatives, had established that Lassman was drowned while trying to save the lives of three boys whom he, in his capacity as a counselor at Camp Kaskela, had taken out for a canoe ride.

Information from the camp at the time of Lassman's death had been to the effect that Lassman, a visitor at the camp, had taken out a canoe late at night without permission, had overturned in rough water and been drowned. A verdict of "accidental death by drowning" was returned by a coroner's jury.

According to the N. Y. U. version of the case, Lassman took the three boys, whose names have not been revealed, for a paddle in quiet water on the afternoon of July 6. In some manner the canoe was overturned and Lassman and the boys were thrown into the water.

The university statement quoted Nemereck as saying that camp authorities had told the counselors that night of the accident but had ordered them not to discuss the affair among themselves or with the boys in the camp.

NOTICE OF APPOINTMENT OF A BEE INSPECTOR

Notice is hereby given that the County Court of Douglas County, acting upon a petition of representative bee owners, has appointed George Anderson, of Roseburg, Oregon, County Bee Inspector.

Under the law it is mandatory upon the owners of bees to secure a license for the maintenance of an apiary, and have such apiaries inspected for the presence of disease. Licenses must be secured from the County Clerk, not later than Sept. 1, 1930. A fee of \$1.00 is charged for each license.

As the presence of bees in the county is necessary for the successful pollination of fruit; the County Court urges that all owners of bees secure licenses for the maintenance of apiaries, and have all stands inspected by the County Bee Inspector for the presence of disease.

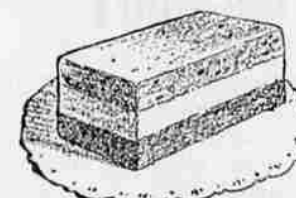
