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PEAR TESTS MADE BY COUNTY AGENT

Maturity tests for pears are being conducted at the office of J. C. Leedy, county agent, where a pear has been installed for that purpose.

The principle on which the machine operates is based on the old method of applying pressure to fruit with the thumb or fingers of the hand. The machine registers on the dial of a set of spring scales, the exact pressure, in pounds, necessary to penetrate the skin and epidermal layers of the pear about one-fourth of an inch.

Experience and experimental tests have shown that pressures of 26 to 32 pounds are the picking range for Bartlett pears.

The tests are quite accurate and give very reliable indications as to the best time to pick the pears. The service is free to residents of Douglas county.

According to Mr. Leedy, pears should be tested within a few hours after picking to secure best results, and samples should be taken from various trees in different parts of the orchards to be representative of the crop as a whole.

An armored train yesterday scattered a skirmish party of Reds which approached within twenty-five miles of Hankow. The bandits previously ambushed a band of badets sent to fight them and took their arms and ammunition. Kiang province dispatches said Kiang summer resort near Kinkiang, has been evacuated by more than five hundred foreigners. Kinkiang itself is nearly emptied of foreigners, who have departed for Shanghai and Hankow.

Chungsha dispatches yesterday said communists, continuing their fiendish acts there, killed one hundred wealthy Chinese held for ransom.

Missionary Tortured
SHANGHAI, Aug. 5.—Stories of torture and other forms of violence involving women missionaries elicited today's reports from the areas infested with communists and bandits.

British consular authorities at Foochow reported desperadoes had chopped a finger from the hand of a British woman missionary at Kienyang, northern Fukien province and sent the severed digit to provincial officials at Yenping along with a demand for \$20,000 ransom for the missionary and her companion, both of whom had been held captive for more than a month.

The message from the desperadoes said the women's other fingers would be chopped off and sent as evidence of the seriousness of the ransom demand unless payment was forthcoming immediately.

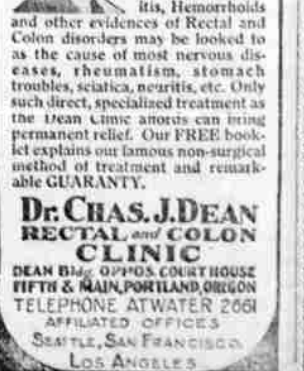
Sleeping Woman Stabbed
The captives are Miss Edith Nettleton and Miss Edith Harrison of the British church missionary society, with headquarters in London. They were seized while traveling from Changan toward Yenching in an attempt to escape from the danger area.

Nankink advices said a Chinese soldier bayoneted and probably fatally wounded Mrs. A. R. J. Hoare, wife of a British official of the Tientsin-Pukow railway, as she slept in her home at Pukow, north of Pukow. The soldier escaped. British consular officials at Nankink protested vigorously to the nationalist foreign office.

Chicago once more advances something unique—an apartment house built entirely of metal, with silver-plated walls of rustless aluminum metal backed by cork-board and rock wool insulation against noise and the weather. The walls will be only 3 1/2 inches thick as compared with the usual 11-inch brick wall, but will have an insulating value equivalent to a 35-inch wall. The floors will be of insulated bathtub deck construction. The thin walls and flooring will add 14 per cent to the rentable space, and the construction cost will be much cheaper. Every known comfort and labor-saving device is to be installed, including electric heating, which will be economically possible through the insulation.

BLAMES RADIO FOR PRESENT DROUGHT

FARMERS FACING WATER SHORTAGE
SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Aug. 5.—Five weeks of drought today had brought many Illinois farmers face to face with the necessity of carrying water long distances to save livestock.

Never in the memory of many farmers, had so many streams failed as water supply. Wells have dried up, too, cutting many farms off from water. Central Illinois farmers were hauling water for three miles or more to have cattle.

Forecaster W. P. Day said the Windy City would be one of the coolest spots in the country for the next two days.

In Illinois, parts of which have had no rain for more than six weeks, the forecast was for showers.

Farmers Face Loss
LEWISTON, Ida., Aug. 5.—Farmers in a 60-square mile path of the Snake river wheat country today faced possible loss of \$300,000 from a freak storm which visited the area yesterday.

Hailstones as large as walnuts hurricanized and searing lightning beat down wheat, knocked a man unconscious, killed a horse and set three fields afire.

Farmers estimated from 90 to 100 per cent of the winter wheat crop, just awaiting harvest, was destroyed with the total for other varieties from 50 to 85 per cent. Estimates based on below average return for the acres devastated placed the damage at more than a century of a million dollars.

Traveling eastward, the storm came out of a murky sky, mixing hailstones, wind and lightning in a furious onslaught. Windows in houses were broken and wheat was leveled by the wind. Trees and telephone lines were blown down. Three wheat fields were fired by lightning.

the people, and any new bond issue must be preceded by an election in which it can be authorized by the voters of the city, but in this case the indebtedness of the city is not being increased, the bond issue merely being a financing plan to meet the maturing obligation and providing a way to raise the funds to meet the debt and its ultimate retirement.

The ordinance was placed on first and second readings last night, the rules were then suspended and the third reading given, followed by unanimous passage of the measure.

Due to the fact that the money must be provided by the first of September, an emergency clause was attached to the ordinance, so that it is of immediate effect. The bonds are to be advertised at once, and the council will meet on the 14th to receive bids.

San Francisco's meeting with the league leading Hollywood Stars at Los Angeles loomed today as an outstanding battle of the Coast League schedule, while opening of night ball in Oakland brought a new experience to bay region fans.

Interest of fans and participants was to a large extent directed toward Chicago, however, for the meeting of the Pacific coast, American association, and International league officials to consider the major leagues' universal draft ultimatum.

The Seals, after losing close series to Sacramento and Oakland, came back to down the Senators six games to one last week and tie with Los Angeles and the Athletics for second place.

Hollywood latched its average at the expense of the northern teams and today was three games ahead of its nearest rivals.

Los Angeles journeyed to San Francisco to play the Athletics, and the second place tie was due to be shifted one way or another.

Sacramento prepared to join the Oaks in the inaugural artificial lighting game at Oakland, both teams meeting at their present positions in the second division.

Seattle and Portland prepared to

battle for northern honors, with the Indians' strong showing of last week making them the favorites.

Turner of Hollywood went into first place in pitching rank, though Zinn of San Francisco had the most victories with seventeen.

Sheely of the Seals, profited by Sacramento's off-form series, and took the batting lead from Severed of Hollywood, with .403 to .391.
