TODAY'S MARKETS

PORTLAND, Aug. 12.—Cantaloupes, peaches and tomatoes are the center of activity in the wholesale market. Present offerings of Yakima cantaloupes are probably the finest quality of the season. A bulletin from the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says California peaches are plentiful and the movement fairly active at steady prices. Demand is good for the best H. Hales, but less active for Cling and Elbertas. Most Elbertas are reported of only fair quality.

Motor truck receipts of more than 300 boxes of tomatoes from the Yakima and other Columbia river districts is the heaviest of the season. The supply exceeds the demand and prices reached our season's low at about 60c a box for the best stock.

New Yakima Scott's Gem potatoes were moving freely at \$1.49 to \$1.75 a hundred. Locals were 25c cheaper.

The egg and butter markets were steady, with eggs particularly firm. Turkeys were eagerly bought at 75c a dozen bunches.

Apples were around a dollar a box for large fruit. Grapes were 1.25 a crate.

Blackberries were \$3.25 a crate; raspberries \$2.50; and loganberries \$2.00 a crate.

Tomatoes were around 60c 75c.
