TOURISTS TRAVEL HELPS MERCHANTS

Of every dollar spent by the tourists of the country, 26c goes directly to the merchants, according to the Oregon State Motor association.

The association bases its statement on an analysis of tourist expenditures made by the research department of the American Automobile association. This means that of the \$4,000,000,000 expended by the nation's motor tourist caravan each year, more than \$1,000,000,000 goes into the tills of merchants and shopkeepers.

Following is a list of items for which the tourist dollar is expended: Merchandise, 26 per cent; restaurants and cafes, 20.5 per cent; hotels and motels, 17.5 per cent; automobile accessories, gas and oil, 11.5 per cent; theatres and amusements, 8.5 per cent; transportation (railroad), 7 per cent; confectioneries and incidentals, 5 per cent; street railways, taxis and buses, 3.5 per cent.
