NEW WITNESSES WILL TESTIFY FOR BILLINGS' PLEA

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 16.—Edwin V. McKennie, attorney for Warren K. Billings, said today new witnesses would be introduced Monday when supreme court justices resume their hearing of Billings' application for a pardon. Billings and Thomas J. Mooney, convicted of complicity in the 1916 preparedness day bombing in San Francisco, are serving life sentences.

McKennie said he preferred not to reveal the identity of the witnesses until they appear in court. He estimated it would take about three more days to complete his case before the justices.

State Senator Edgar S. Hurley, named by Billings at Folsom this week, as a man who hired Billings to carry dynamite during labor troubles in California in 1916, has been refused permission to question Billings before the supreme court, in an attempt to clear himself of the charges. The court held Hurley's interest was immaterial.

Hurley issued a statement in which he said he expected to be re-elected to the state senate this year and would "have something to say" to the supreme court then.
