THE GOOD WILL ROOMS

Unless one is keenly observant as he looks over the new home of the Evening Kansas-Republican at Newton, Kan., it will probably happen that one of its most significant aspects will be overlooked. The complete plan is laid out on the ground floor. The main part of the building is one story in height. The front portion of the building, however, is two stories in height. In an explanatory booklet there is one sentence which contains a hint of the need for the second story. It is this: "The Good-Will Room will be found on the second floor."

Mounting the steps at the entrance displaying a notice, "Good-Will Room Upstairs," the visitor finds himself in a commodious, well-lighted and well-furnished room. Everything is arranged to give the room a homelike, "cozy" appearance. Rugs on the floor, pictures on the wall, and rocking chairs for those who like them. The room is capable of seating about 200.

When the new plant was being built not long ago, John Mack, then president of the company, planned to provide this room as a place where social groups which are often hampered in the furtherance of their social fellowship by lack of a suitable meeting place, could have a place to meet. The result was "The Good-Will Room" of the Kansas-Republican.

Since its opening less than a year ago it has come to be a recognized asset to the community. Reunions of various societies desiring a formal atmosphere than that of a hotel dining room find the "Good-Will Room" a delightful place in which to meet.

Mr. Mack lived to see how excellently this upper room was fulfilling the ideal which gave him the idea to build higher than he needed, so far as his business was concerned.

To the east of the large room is a smaller room furnished tastefully in colonial style by Mrs. John Mack, who has succeeded to the place left vacant by her husband. Here, as in a home, smaller groups can meet for fellowship and conference.—News story from Newton, Kansas, July 12, 1930.
