SIX WOMEN TAKE OFF IN AIRPLANE DERBY SOUTHWARD

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.—Six women fliers, three carrying lucky pieces, hopped off today from the Washington airport on the first leg of the Dixie air derby. They headed due south toward their first stop, Richmond.

The fliers, in the order of their moment apart take off were Phoebe Omlie, Memphis; Mrs. Vera D. Walker, Los Angeles; Mrs. Marie Bowman, Los Angeles; Laura in tall, Kansas City; Nancy Hopkins, Washington; and Mrs. Charty Landson, Norfolk, Va. They are due to reach Chicago next Tuesday.

Mrs. Omlie had a silver rabbit's foot in her red and yellow mono coupe.

Mrs. Walker dug into her purse and pulled out a rubber horse shoe.

Mrs. Hopkins sheepishly stooped from the pocket of her leather jacket "the left hind leg of a grave yard rabbit."

ENID, Okla., Aug. 22.—Maintain her lead over other contestants in the women's air derby, Gladys O'Donnell of Long Beach, Cal., landed here from Amarillo today.

Marjorie Dolg of Danbury, Conn., was second to land.

Ruth Barron of Hollywood was the third to arrive.

Aldred Morgan of Beverly Hills, Cal., was forced down 31 miles southwest of Enid and Jene La Rene, Kansas City, was obliged to land in a storm four miles south of Waukomia. At noon Ruth Stewart of St. Louis was unreported.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Aug. 22.—Eddie Schneider, 18, holder of the junior transcontinental east-west flight record, left Albuquerque at 7:55 a. m. (M. S. T.) for Wichita, Kan., after spending the night here. He will stop tonight at Wichita and hopes to complete the flight to New York Saturday and lower the west-east record of 28 hours and 55 minutes.

Schneider's elapsed time from Los Angeles to Albuquerque was seven hours 28 minutes. He lost half an hour in circling to get over the San Bernardino mountains because of his heavy load of moon pie. His magnetic compass also failed him and he was forced to fly by dead reckoning.

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
