A great deal of local interest is being shown in the Josephine county fair to be presented at Grants Pass September 4 to 7 inclusive. The program announced for the fair indicates one of the largest events of its kind ever held in southern Oregon.

The entertainment program shows all time well filled. Eighty-five head of horses are entered already in the racing events, which will be presented both afternoon and evening. The Grants Pass track is one of the best lighted in the west, so that night races will be of particular interest.

VARIOUS FOREST
FIRES IN DOUGLAS
SAID CONTROLLED

The forest fire situation in the county was reported favorable today, despite three additional incendiary fires yesterday afternoon near Tye. The new fires were strung out several hundred yards apart, but were quickly discovered and were controlled within a few hours, after burning over about eight acres of brush and grasslands.

Edison Jackson, in charge of the crew fighting the 19 incendiary fires on South Myrtle Creek, reported last night that the fires had been trenched and were under control. The crews remained over the trenched fires, cutting brush, snags, and getting the fires in shape to leave, returning to the Roseburg fire station this morning, shortly before noon. A patrol is being left to keep the fires from jumping the trenches.

Feed Southwick, deputy superintendent, reported that last night a crew had been fighting a number of five incendiary fires that burned over about 15 acres. These fires gave considerable trouble, but were all under control last night, Mr. Southwick reports.
