(Portland, Aug. 29.—Portland wholesale market prices held steady today at the advance given. Up grades Thursday. Receipts were reported somewhat heavier while storage stock continued to move in to trade. Egg market remained unchanged in tone and price with receipts and demand good. Government market report on fruits and vegetables gave a slight weakening by heavy receipts including 100 crates from Roseburg by motor truck and a carload of 30-pound bags from California. Green beans are at their lowest point of the year, selling to retail as low as 2-3c a pound. Peak of the Yakima peach season will be here in a few days. Large J. H. Hales are topping the market at \$1.25 a box. Pear market continues dull. Bartlett are selling eastward unsold. Wool quiet but steady. BOSTON, Aug. 29.—The Committee Bulletin of Boston tomorrow will say: "The wool market is quieter but prices are firm. There is an undertone of strength, especially in the finer qualities. Downside will favor the weaker grades of the finer grades but there is more interest in weaker descriptions. Sheepskin market is now without material change. The wool market is firm, while crossbreeds are a bit on the easy side. Interest is
