TODAY'S MARKETS

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 3.—Whole-sale butter market continued easy in tone and egg market steady with ruling quotations unchanged for each day.

Highlights of fruit and vegetable trade were reported by the government market news service as follows:

Potatoes showed a weaker tendency, with liberal arrivals from Yakima in prospect. Good combination grade Yakima Gems sold to Portland jobbers around 1.15 per cwt. E. O. B. Extra tracks.

Apples and grapes are enjoying fairly good demand; 500 boxes of apples, or more, are being received from Yakima daily, by motor-truck.

The Rainier-Marshall district is now sending about 150 crates of cauliflower to Portland daily; this city being the major distributing center. This crop-movement will terminate within the next few days.

Eggs: Prices to retailers: Fresh extras, 23c; standards, 20c; fresh medium, 20c. Prices to wholesalers to under price to retailers.

Butter: Cubes, Extra, 25c; standards, 25c; prime firsts, 26c; firsts, 26c. Creamery prices: Prints, 36c over cube standards.

Milk: Raw milk (4 per cent) \$2.30 a 2.40 cwt. Sterilized Portland, less 1 per cent; grade B milk, \$2.45. But-terfat, delivered in Portland 35c.

Poultry (chicken, broilers): Alive, heavy hens over 4 1/2 lbs., 22c; medium hens 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 lbs., 15c; light hens 12c; broilers, 15c to 24c; 1 lb. lechons, heavy spring 18c; light 22c; colored 22c. Pekin ducks, 4 lbs. and over, 16c; old, 15c; colored ducks, 12c; ducks, 12c.
