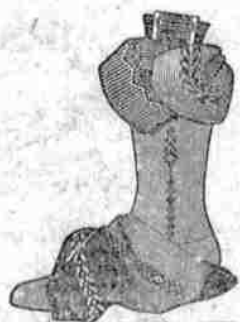

In order to soften liquid floor wax a housewife placed the bottle under a hot water faucet, thereby cracking it.

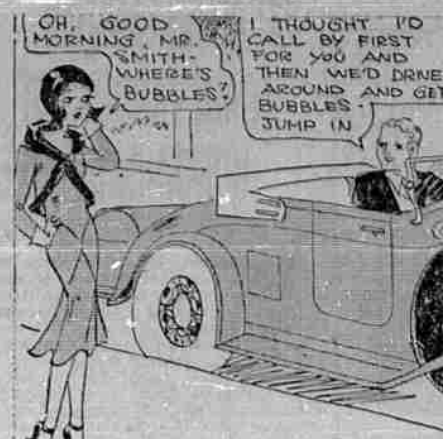
The gases generated by the heat were exploded by a lighted electric range four feet away and the room burst into flames.
