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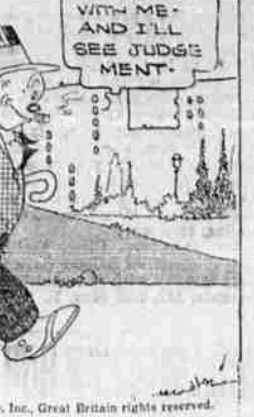

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JENKINS NAMED ON NATIONAL BODY TO SURVEY SCHOOLS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 18.—Frank Jenkins, Eugene, Oregon, newspaper publisher, was today named by Secretary Ray Lyman Wilbur as Oregon's member of the advisory committee of laymen of the national survey of secondary education.

Mr. Jenkins, representing Oregon, will be one of 56 distinguished laymen from every state in the union, who will supplement a group of outstanding educators in an attempt to find out where in the high school world unusual successes have been attained, and to bring those successes to the attention of other communities.

The importance of this study is indicated by the overwhelming increase in high school attendance in this generation. Office of education figures show that in 1910 but 10 per cent of students of high school age were in those schools, while at present more than 50 per cent of such pupils, an aggregation of more than 4,000,000, attend.

This study of secondary education, which is to extend over three years, was authorized by congress in 1929. That congress laid down a program under which a total expenditure of \$250,000 might be made.

The purpose is to provide the facts which may aid in the development of a better system of secondary schools for the future.

The high school of the nation is a huge institution which blankets its map from coast to coast, being almost always under local control. It has offered unlimited opportunity for experimentation and for a demonstration of the merit or lack of merit of principles and theories. In the pursuit of practical results the endeavor will be to select the outstanding successes with the various problems of high school education and to make information regarding those successes available to schools everywhere.
