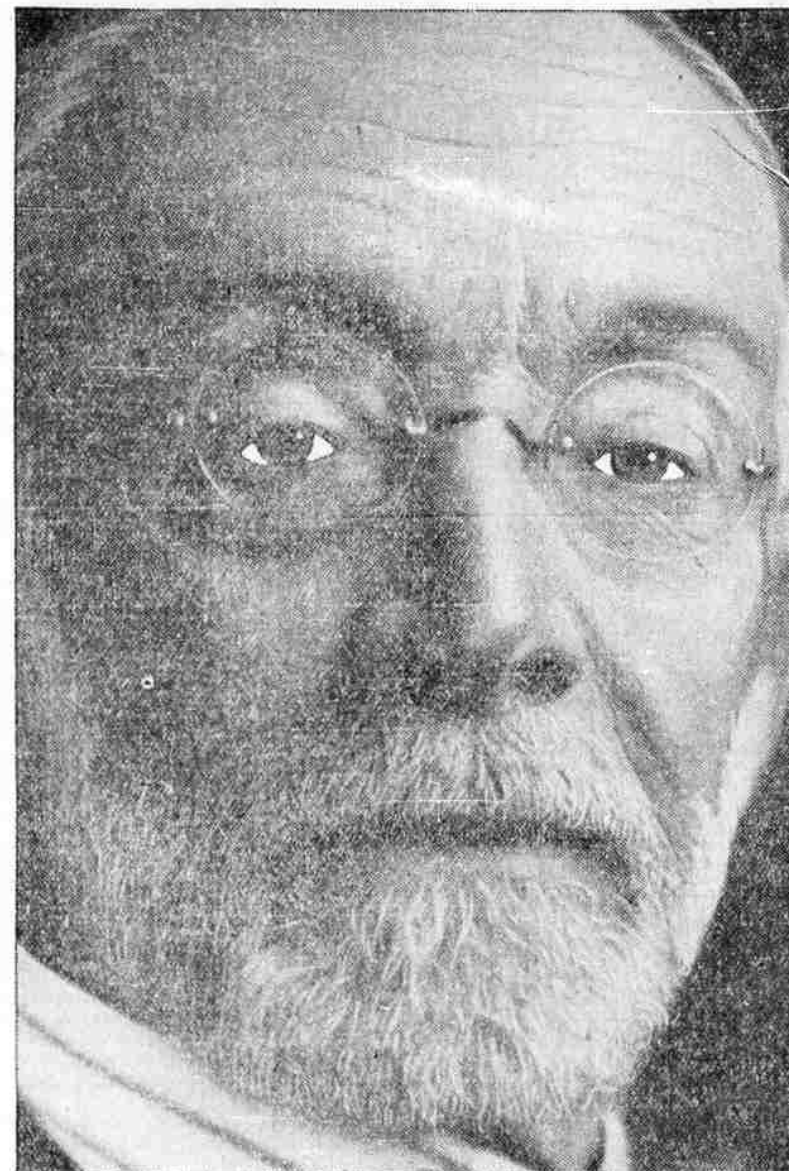

SUPPLY OF TURKEYS FOR THANKSGIVING REPORTED AMPLE

(Associated Press Special Wire)

CORVALLIS, Oct. 21.—Reports from the department of agriculture in Washington, D. C., received by the Oregon State college market service also assurance of an average supply of turkeys for Thanksgiving.

Government estimates place the 1930 crop at 3 per cent below that of last year, but greater than that of the two previous seasons.

A 100 per cent decrease in the big commercial states was partially offset by an increase in the east and central states where the drought made turkey raising favorable.

The current shortage is added to by the fact that stocks of frozen turkeys are 40 per cent below last year's supplies. This circumstance improves the market outlook for producers.

DEND, Oct. 21.—Thirty-eight Cook counties have joined the turkey growers in Deschutes and

Central Oregon Turkey Growers' association. Seven thousand are now represented by the membership and another five thousand is sought.

EUREKA, Cal., Oct. 21.—Killed when their automobile plunged over a 500-foot embankment, the bodies of A. B. Knous and W. H. Knous, brothers, were found near Orbeaus, Humboldt county, late yesterday. The accident must have happened a week or so ago. Papers carried by the men indicated they were contractors doing business in Portland under the name of Knous Brothers. Their automobile lodged in a tree.

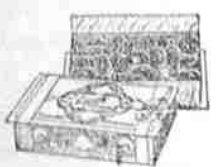
