8,000 MASSACRED IN LATEST ATTACK OF CHINESE REDS

(Associated Press Leased Wire) KIUKIANG, China, Oct. 22.—Bishop Mignani of the Italian Lazarist mission at Kian, Kiangsi province, one of the sixteen missions abducted when outlaws ransacked the central Kiangsi city, said here today, 8,000 residents of Kian had been slaughtered by the invaders.

Additional Kiukiang advisers originating from other sources said nationalist authorities were experiencing difficulties in forcing the few remaining nationalist soldiers in Kiangsi to fight the red soldiers. The advice said the armed men were adopting the slogan "soldiers don't fight soldiers."

PINCHOT CLAIMS HOOVER SUPPORT; DAVIS DISPUTED

(Associated Press Leased Wire) WASHINGTON, Penna., Oct. 21.—President Hoover stands for the election of the entire republican ticket in Pennsylvania in the November 4 election, Gifford Pinchot, republican gubernatorial candidate, declared in an address here today.

Pinchot's declaration was in direct conflict with that made yesterday at Uniontown by Secretary Davis, United States senatorial nominee. Davis said: "The president has not endorsed any candidate, and he cannot even endorse
