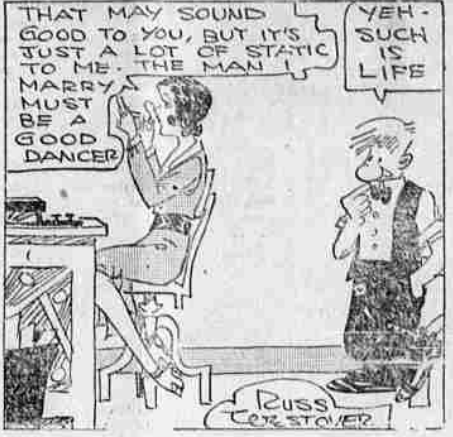

MURPHY MAKES REPORT ON CRUISE FOR HIGHWAY LINK

Joe Murphy, local timber cruiser, who was recently appointed by the county court to determine the amount of timber on the ground needed for right of way for the Roosevelt highway north of Gardiner, returned to Roseburg yesterday. He reports that there are a million and a quarter feet of standing timber on the 4 1/2 mile stretch of proposed roadway. The road viewers are leaving within a short time to estimate the value of the property. Mr. Murphy also reported that there is a fine stand of timber between the proposed road and the ocean, although the strip is narrow, and it was suggested that the state make some effort to acquire this land for park purposes, and to assure protection for the road from drifting sand. The county court has written this suggestion to the highway commission and the state parks board.
