

LEWIS PLURALITY IN ILLINOIS MAY HANG UP RECORD

Nearing 500,000, Largest
Ever Gained in State
by Candidate for
U. S. Senate.

Advocates Repeal of 18th
Amendment; Derives No
Joy in Defeat of
Woman Rival.

(Associated Press Local Wire)
CHICAGO, Nov. 5.—James Ham-
ilton Lewis, picturesque democrat
has been returned to the United
States senate.

The former senator and demo-
cratic whip in the administration
of President Woodrow Wilson re-
ceived the Illinois senatorial vote
yesterday in a landslide of demo-
cratic votes that swamped his two
women opponents. Congress-
woman Ruth Hanna McCormick
republican, and Mrs. Lottie Hol-
man O'Neill, independent. Re-
turns indicated he would receive
the largest plurality ever given a
senatorial candidate in Illinois. It
may reach 500,000.

Thus he became the first demo-
crat ever elected to the senate
from Illinois by popular vote. None
of his party ever has been chosen
to the senate since Illinois aban-
doned the practice of having the
legislature select the state's sena-
tors. He will join Otis F. Glenn,
republican, from Illinois in the
senate and serve a six year term,
taking office in December, 1931.

Lewis advocated, among other
things, a repeal of the 18th amend-
ment, and "state's rights" in the
liquor issue.

Voters Rap Dry Law
At the same time, the returns
showed that the voters expressed
sentiment against the 18th amend-
ment and the Illinois prohibition
law and in favor of permitting
beverages which a referendum pro-
posed described as "not in fact
intoxicating" as determined in ac-
cordance with the laws of the re-
spective states.

Mrs. McCormick, who contended
that economic ills and keeping
America out of the world courts
were the issues rather than prohi-
bition, smiled in defeat, congrat-
ulated the winner, and then came
right back with a statement she
would, as a congresswoman, "as-

ist in a solution of the present
difficulties which concern the peo-
ple." But Lewis did not smile. In-
stead he paid Mrs. McCormick a
high tribute for her "valorous
fight" and declared he did not like
the "aspect of joy toward the de-
America out of the world courts
feat of a woman."

Lewis was born in Virginia and
is known far and wide as "one of
the most polite men in America."

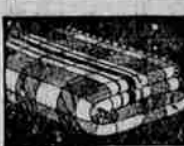
