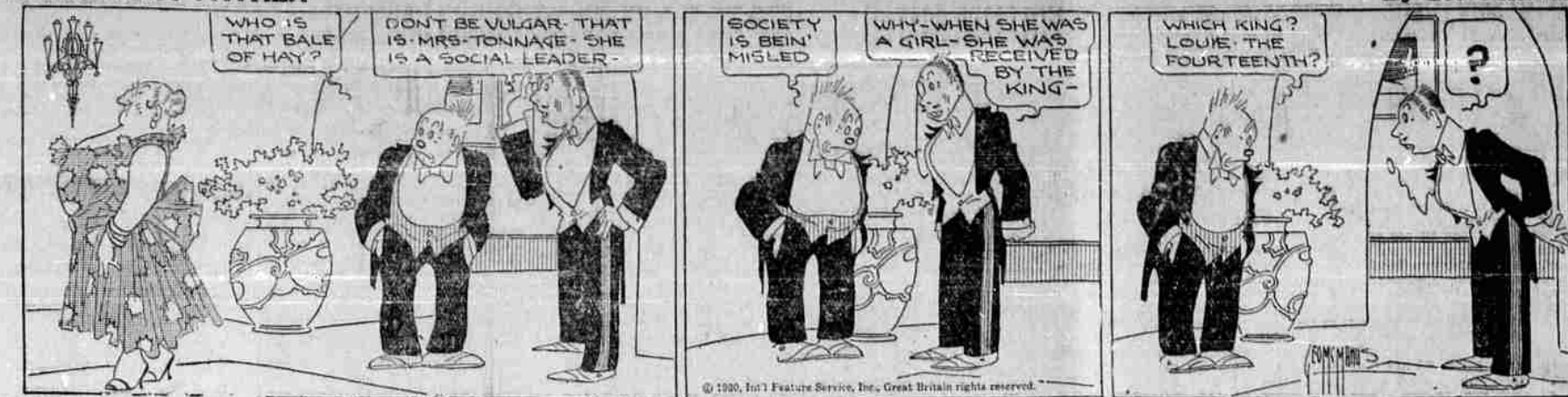

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DOUGLAS SCHOOLS TO BE INSPECTED AS TO STANDARDS

SALEM, Nov. 10 — Douglas county's high schools may soon expect a visit from James Burgess, assistant state superintendent of schools.

Burgess is now making a tour of the state for an inspection of every standard high school. In accordance with state laws, the inspection must be carried out once a year to see that standards are being maintained.

Already Burgess has visited enough high schools to form a general opinion as to their qualifications and standards.

In general, the high schools are fulfilling the state standards to a fairly normal degree," Burgess said. "Only occasionally do I find one far below standard. In view of the school situation in the state these conditions might be excused."

Oregon has many small institutions that could not be found in any other state in the nation. Due to the expense of high school maintenance, school districts have difficulty in attaining the high degree of efficiency that is maintained in states of similar size.

Teachers of the highest qualification, fine equipment and good plants are nearly impossible in the many thinly populated districts of Oregon where school registration is slight.

According to educational authorities, this situation again emphasizes the need of a state fund to maintain the even standard among high schools in all sections.

School authorities in most instances are willing to co-operate with us in the maintenance of a normal school district," Burgess said.
