

IDLE MEN HELPED BY EXPANSION OF FOREST PROGRAM

Annual Appropriation for
Improvements Raised
\$5,000,000 Under
New Law.

Apportionment of \$9,500,000 in forest highway funds this year to 29 states and 2 territories is making possible more rapid road construction on the national forests and is also aiding unemployment, says the forest service, U. S. department of agriculture.

Many of the projects will be completed by next July. To encourage employment of labor the forest service is urging early completion wherever possible.

In most of the regions receiving forest highway funds, the allocated amount will be more than double that of the last fiscal year. For five years the annual federal appropriation for forest highways has been \$4,500,000. Under provisions of the Cady-Coleman law, an additional fund of \$5,000,000 became available for the first time last July, to be used in the current fiscal year.

Division of these funds for construction of highways within and adjacent to national forests is made on the basis of area and value of the forests. Half the amount is apportioned according to the ratio of the national forest area in a given state to the total area of all the national forests. The other half is divided in proportion to the value of the national forest lands in each state.

This road-building activity, more than doubled this year, is part of a continuing program. An equal amount of federal funds has already been appropriated for the work in the fiscal year 1932.

In addition to the expanded program of forest highway construction, the forest service is continuing, with funds from other appropriations, the construction and maintenance work on secondary roads, and on protection roads and trails in the national forests.

California leads in the apportionment for the year ending June 30, 1931, with a total of \$1,438,063. Oregon is second with a total of \$1,334,195, as against \$632,633 allotted for the preceding year.
