CONTAGIOUS SKIN DISEASES APPEAR IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The prevalence of skin diseases, known as impetigo and scabies, has been very marked during the past few weeks both in the Roseburg schools and the schools throughout the county, according to Dr. B. R. Shoemaker, Douglas county health officer. Both of these diseases are very contagious and should be checked in their earlier stages, he states.

Parents and teachers are urged to send any child showing the least indication of skin irritation or sores to the family physician or to the office of the health unit in the court house, in order that these skin conditions may be cleared up and the epidemic stopped.

The health unit reports the following activities for the week ended November 15th: Literature distributed 30, press articles 2, cases communicable diseases reported 2, cases released 2, diphtheria immunizations given 13, Wasserman tests made 2, water samples taken 1, nursing calls 1, prenatal calls 1, preschool visits 1, infant visits 2, school child visits 2, school inspections for contagion 28, pupils excluded 2, pupils treated 1, child clinics 1 with an attendance of 3 children, children treated in dental clinic 7, home visits by H. O. I. visits to county home 1, visits to county jail 3, visits to hospital 7, patients treated 5, prisoners examined 3, office conferences 29, letters sent out 46, telephone calls 37, total mileage both nurses 245.

Conditions in the trade were reviewed by the government market news service as follows: Ungraded, and packed and filled packs of apples continue to dominate the Portland market; but supplies of these packs are considerably less than in previous years, due to elimination of ranch-packing, and more reliance on smaller lots. Off-grade stock is now moving to cannery and other markets. The current market is steady with most of the current loadings selling prior to shipment.

Primary supplies of northwest cranberries are about depleted, stocks now being all in distributors' hands. Under present conditions, no shortage is anticipated.
