

OAKLAND CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS BUDGET FOR 1931

City Expense Estimated at \$7,660, of Which \$6,500 Be Raised by Taxation.

City Has Materially Cut Its Indebtedness During Past Few Years and Has Good Outlook.

(News-Review Douglas County Special)
OAKLAND, Nov. 20.—The regular meeting of the city council was held Tuesday evening, all members being present. The budget for the coming year was adopted as proposed, there being no objections offered. The budget calls for a levy of \$6500, the same as last year. Of this amount \$2900 will be required to pay bonds due next year; \$2400 interest on outstanding bonds, salaries of city officials amount to \$1000, electric current and fire protection require an outlay of \$1500 and other expenses were placed at \$560. Estimated receipts total \$1160.

Oakland is one city that has materially reduced its indebtedness in the last ten years. In 1920 there was outstanding \$67,000 in light and water bonds, \$8,000 in Hancock bonds and \$1,000 in city warrants. Net indebtedness is now \$25,000, and this at present is being reduced \$2,000 a year. A bond issue in the amount of \$15,000 is due next year but the city has sufficient funds in its sinking fund to meet this obligation.

Prior to August, 1929, the city owned the water system and the electric distribution system, purchasing electric current from the California-Oregon Power company. August 1 the light and water systems were sold to the power company for \$25,000. During the last year considerable new water pipe has been laid and a general overhauling of the light system has taken place greatly improving the service and making the use of electric ranges for cooking possible.
