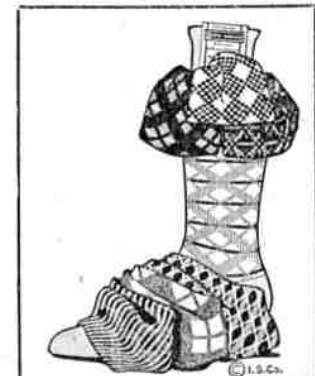
Transacting Business in Portland—C. W. Parker, owner of the Roseburg garage, is spending several days in Portland this week attending to business affairs.

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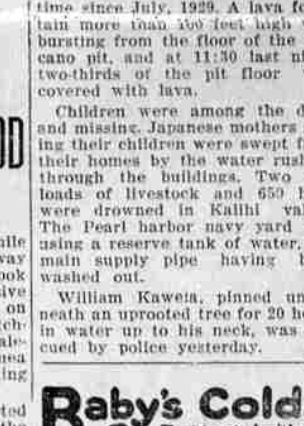
