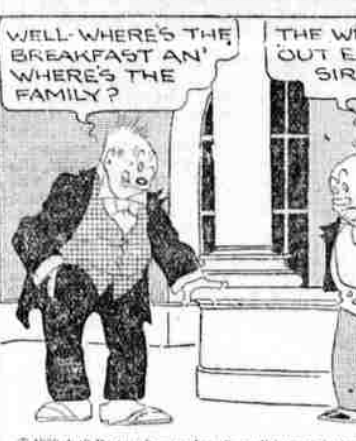

EDITOR'S ORIGINAL EPITAPH BANS ALL FORMS OF SORROW

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Nov. 28.—An epitaph written by himself shortly before his death was read today at the funeral services of Richard Howell, editor of the Bridgeport Herald for the past forty years.

Howell's epitaph, read by Rev. E. J. Craft, of Christ Episcopal church, follows:

"I want no crape to hang upon the door when I die;

"I want no bell to toll the way to where I lie;

"I want no sorrowful prayers upraised to Him on high;

"I want no heart to sob nor any heart to cry;

"I want the flowers, the bees, the birds, to be around the day I go;

"I want a bird to sing his song of evening soft and low;

"I want a bee to buzz around the place I rest;

"I want a flower to bloom upon the mound atop my breast."

MISSING WOMAN'S SUITCASE FOUND; MURDER FEARED

FORT MORGAN, Colo., Nov. 28.—With their first tangible clue in nearly two weeks as an incentive, Morgan county authorities today continued their efforts to solve the mystery of the strange disappearance of Miss Edith Marriott, 28-year-old Wiggins, Colo., school teacher.

A suitcase identified as belonging to Miss Marriott was found in an irrigation ditch five miles east of Wiggins, yesterday.

It contained several articles of clothing and an insurance policy for \$1,000, taken out by Miss Marriott and naming her mother as the beneficiary.

Sheriff R. A. Johnson said the finding of the suitcase further convinced him the teacher had been kidnapped and slain. He believes the woman's body will be found at some point near the spot where the suitcase was discovered. A sheriff's posse planned to leave here today to search the irrigation ditch.

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CHRISTNER TAKES TWO DIVES OUT OF RING IN CHICAGO

Apparent Force of Mickey Walker's Blows Fails to Impress Crowd, Which Boos.

CHICAGO, Nov. 29.—Some of the approximately 4,000 who went to the coliseum last night to see Mickey Walker fight K. O. Christner, today believed the world midweight champion knocked the Akron rubber man clear out of the ring—but most of them harbored a suspicion Christner landed among the spectators at least partly by his own efforts.

The finish of what was listed as a ten-round encounter in which Walker gave away 33 3/4 pounds in his second raid among the heavyweights, came after 38 seconds of fighting. Walker charged out of his corner, smacking Christner with a hard right to the jaw and a left to the head, dropping him in front of the three members of the Illinois State Athletic commission. He arose at the count of three and retreated to the opposite side of the ring where another left hook caught him and he sailed between the second and top strands of the ring.

Crowd Disgusted

Christner landed among the spectators and rolled over the press table, falling to the floor where he lay as the officials tolled off 20 seconds. Under Illinois rules, a fighter knocked from the ring is entitled to 20 seconds during which to return.

At the end of the count he staggered to his feet and struggled through the ropes, limping on his right leg. He was helped to his corner where he said he could not continue. The fight was awarded to Walker.

Even before the decision was announced officially, the crowd mill ed down toward the ring shouting "Take" and booing and hissing.

Freak Beats Dillon

Whatever the customers thought of the main bout, they apparently enjoyed the semi-final hugely. Patting Bozo, Curtis Hambricht, of Birmingham, Ala., compared a contest with surprising effectiveness to gain a decision over Harry Dillon of Winnipeg, Man., in eight rounds. Dillon failed to land a solid blow on the grinning, swaying, bobbing southerner, while Bozo lashed out at intervals to score almost as he pleased.
