

SALE OF CHRISTMAS SEALS IN DOUGLAS PLEASES SPONSORS

The returns from the sale of Christmas seals throughout the county are coming in fine, Mrs. H. C. Boyle, county seal sale chairman announced today. Many schools having sold their quotas, requested additional seals and the response in nearly every community has been excellent.

"If the enthusiasm being evinced by the children of the grade schools in Roseburg is at all indicative of the success of the sale of Christmas seals this year, we certainly have every reason to anticipate one of our largest sales," said Mrs. Boyle. "The sale of seals began in the local grade schools today and we find the children very generous."

"Through an error in mailing a few people received letters containing no seals. Some have already written in for the seals. We shall be glad to supply anyone with seals at any time."

Support Pleases
"Several merchants and citizens in Roseburg are planning to use the tuberculosis Christmas seals on packages and letters used. Mrs. S. W. Starmer, who is department president of the Spanish-American War Veterans auxiliary, is using the seals on all her official correspondence. We are very glad to have this support."

Tuberculosis seals will always be a popular and profitable form of investment, according to officials of the Douglas County Public Health association, which sponsors the sale of seals, because they cost so little, they are seasonal, useful and ornamental, and the returns from them work hard on the all-year-round basis to alleviate suffering from the greatest scourge mankind has ever known.

Cautionary Words
Two words of caution are issued by the local association, as follows: First, only seals which contain the scarlet double-barred Lorraine cross, international symbol of the anti-tuberculosis movement, and the words "Buy Christmas Seals Fight Tuberculosis" are official, and sold solely for the purpose of raising funds for the anti-tuberculosis campaign. All other seals are purely commercial and have no connection with the tuberculosis movement.

Second: Users of Christmas seals are cautioned not to put them on the face of mail matter. They can be used, according to United States postal regulations, only on the reverse side of letters and packages.

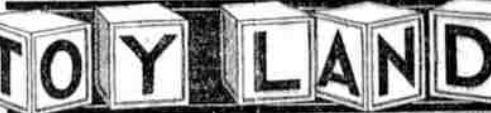
