TODAY'S MARKETS

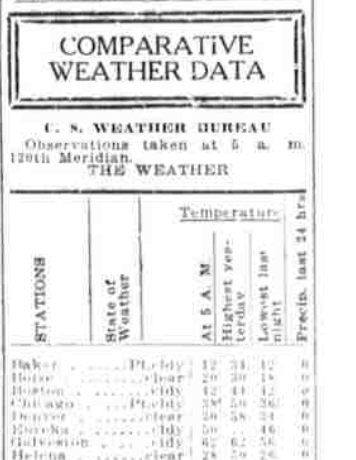

Butter market was firm, prices steady, demand good and receipts rather light.

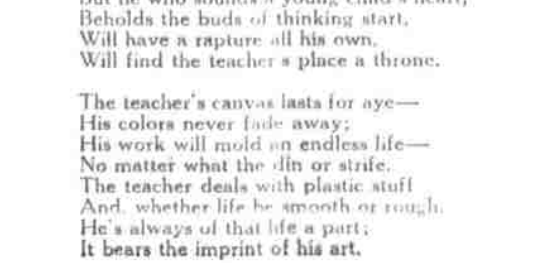
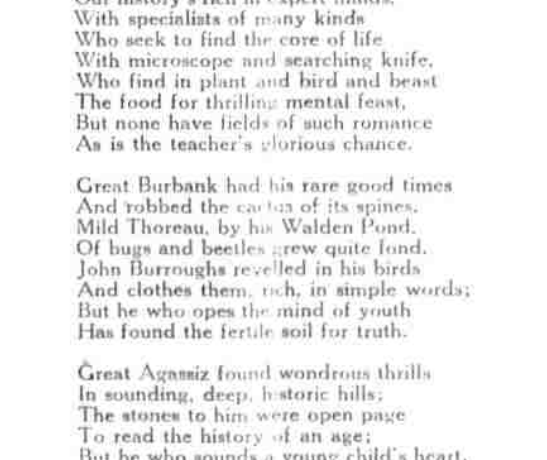
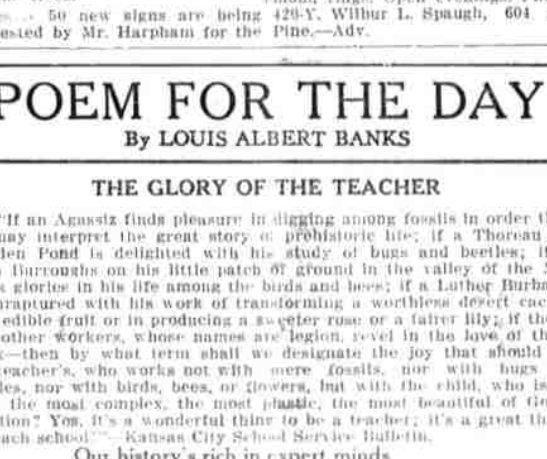
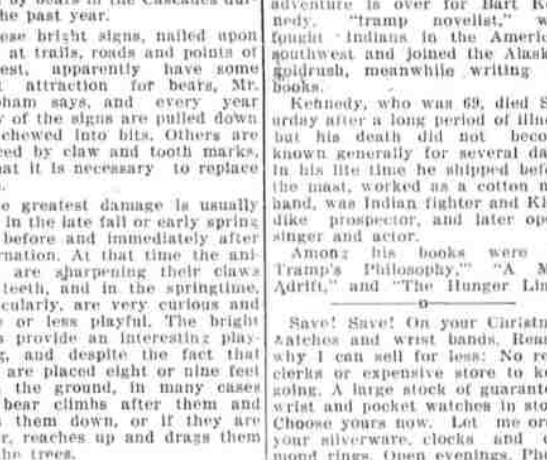

INDUSTRIAL HEADS VOICE THEIR NEEDS

PORTLAND, Dec. 10.—Passing resolutions looking toward the betterment of industrial and trade conditions in the west, to be forwarded to the national chamber of commerce, the selection of Spokane as the next meeting place, were the final actions of the western division of the chamber of commerce of the United States in their closing session yesterday. Dates for the next meeting were not set.

Resolutions recommended the national chamber determine what action is necessary to free natural resources industries from uncertainties caused by laws; investigation into silver situation as it affects trade with South America and the Orient; need for additional funds to protect forests from white pine blister, insects, fires, other natural enemies; early construction of highway from Alaska to South America and appropriation of federal funds for road approaches to national parks; development of airports by private capital; belief the federal government should provide for legislative financing of irrigation, reclamation, levee and drainage bonds and other indebtedness; investigate alleged purchasing of prison-labor supplies by the government, and commend the treasury for its effort to protect American markets from influx of convict-made goods.
