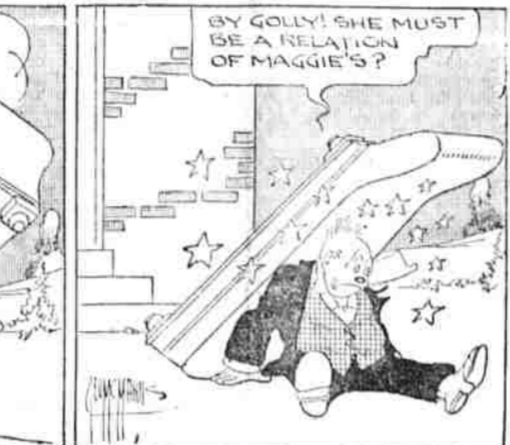

## EMPLOYMENT PLAN EMBRACES EVERY COUNTY IN OREGON

(Associated Press Leased Wire)  
SALEM, Ore., Dec. 11—Registration, through the county courts, of persons needing employment, and work provided for them on state road jobs, is, in substance, the plan that has been worked out by Governor Norblad, Chairman Van Duzer of the state highway commission, and State Labor Commissioner Gram as a measure to relieve unemployment. The arrangement is to continue for three months, or until spring work opens up.

To start, it is believed about 50 counties of the state will be employed throughout the state. If the number of registrations warrant it may be necessary to divide the workers into two groups, working three days each weekly. All jobs will be by hand labor so as many men as possible may be used. It was at first planned to divert about \$500,000 of state highway money to county and market road work, but J. M. Devers, attorney for the highway commission, has ruled that this cannot be done locally, so all emergency employment will be on the state highways. County courts, however, may subdivide the work into community units handled through some recognized organization. All persons registering must show they are bona fide residents of the state or county. Governor Norblad will appoint one person in each county as registration chairman, and registration blanks will be sent out by Commissioner Gram. An effort will be made to provide work in every county. The work will consist mainly of widening roadbeds, ditching, cutting brush, etc. In general the work will be near cities or large communities so the men can return to their homes at night. No camps will be established. Work will begin simultaneously all over the state. Wages will be moderate, but sufficient, the officials believe, to provide help for those in need.

The chairman in each county will be the nucleus for a county organization. The registration will also serve for employment in other lines.

To help out the situation the highway commission is contracting a number of jobs that ordinarily would not be placed until spring.
