This project would provide a highway connection between Canyonville and Trail. The bureau will equal a sum of \$35,000 of the county for this project.
Approximately \$285,000, of which \$142,500 will be taken from the forest highway fund, will be designated for grading 5.3 miles of the Willamette highway to a point near Oakridge, including construction

of a bridge.
Eight miles of highway construction east from Detroit, in Marion county, totaling about \$200,000 will be financed by county and governmental cooperation. This is part of the proposed route from Salem and Albany to Sisters and Bend, known as the North Santiam highway.

Widening and improving the alignment of the Wapinitia highway from a point east of the government camp on the Mount Hood Loop highway south to Clear Lake, at a cost of \$190,000, is included in the program announced by Mr. Lynch.

Grading of about two miles in the northern section of the 4.5-mile gap in the Heppner-Spray highway will be started with \$75,000.

A gap between the two projects now under contract on the Pendleton-John Day highway route south of Union, will be financed by state, county and federal money. The cost of this job will approximate \$261,000.
The program contemplates spending \$155,000 forest highway money on grading a three-mile section of the Canyon City-Burns highway. A section of the Diamond Lake route extending 5.3 miles from the junction at Union creek toward Diamond Lake will be graded with an appropriation of \$138,000. The project will also include clearing a portion of the road from the vicinity of Diamond Lake to the Dallas-California highway.
