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MORE RESIDENTS, WEALTH GAINED BY OREGON IN 1930

Concrete evidence of the substantial growth in new people and new wealth in all parts of Oregon is contained in the December report of the state chamber of commerce which shows a total of 138 out-of-state families who arrived and who bought 8,312 acres of land and invested \$425,884. The annual report, just issued by Manager W. G. Ide, shows a total of 1003 new families for the year who bought 96,533 acres of land and who invested in this land, equipment, household goods and other forms of property a total of \$3,703,660. The six year period just closed by the state chamber shows a grand total of 5,292 amply financed, practical farm families that have been attracted to this state who have purchased 262,535 acres of land in all counties of Oregon and who have brought \$21,576,538 in new capital. Manager Ide points out that these 5,292 families have increased the annual purchasing power of our citizens by at least \$5,000,000.

Interesting features of the report are the increase in out-of-state automobile registrations from California, which rose from 52,236 in 1929 to 57,320 in 1930, while total registrations showed a slight decrease; an increase in new families coming from California to Oregon, which was practically nothing five years ago to approximately 40% of all new people coming into Oregon in 1930. During the first year's operation of the Los Angeles office of the state chamber over 100 farms were purchased by Californians who were sent to this state. Manager Ide reports that because of the consistent advertising and follow-up work of the state chamber in past years, even greater results may be expected in 1931.

BLAZE DAMAGES ROOF, WALL PAPER

Bass met the shifty Massey in a return bout at the arena last night and was voted the winner by a wide margin after 19 rounds. He scaled 138½, a half pound more than his opponent.

MEAT RETAILING IS DENIED TO PACKERS

(Associated Press Leased Wire)

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—The packers' consent decree was modified yesterday to allow the four leading groups of packers to handle vegetables, fruits, milk, coffee, teas, cereals and a number of other products up to the doors of retail grocery stores.

They were not allowed, however, under the decision of Justice Jennings Bailey in the District of Columbia supreme court, to engage in the retailing of meats or other products.

These were the high points in Justice Bailey's ruling in a case which has been in the courts in one form or another almost since the decree was entered into between the packers and the government in February, 1920.

Government counsel during argument contended Justice Bailey had no authority to modify the decree.

The National Wholesale Grocers' association and the American Wholesale Grocers' association intervened in opposition to modification.

Justice Bailey said "The control by the defendant of the great amounts of interstate commerce in meat and other articles from the producer to the consumer would probably result in the almost complete annihilation of the independent grocer, already a minority in number."

The packers had contended that the increasing competition by chain stores made it necessary they be allowed to sell their products at retail.

ICE CARRIES MEN AND HORSES TO SEA

ASTRAKHAN, U. S. S. R., Jan. 6.—Rescue parties were mobilized today to save the lives of fifty fishermen and their horses who were carried out to the Caspian sea yesterday when a huge mass of ice on which they were fishing broke loose from shore.

SIX PERISH WHEN BLAST SINKS BOAT

COLOMBO, Ceylon, Jan. 6.—Six lives are believed to have been lost in the dramatic sinking of the Norwegian steamer Tricolor which sent down just off this port yesterday five minutes after a terrific explosion. The accident occurred in full sight of crowds who lined the shore.

Those believed dead are the captain of the vessel, the third officer, one passenger, and two members of the crew. The wireless operator is also missing.

The French steamer Porfiro, which hurried to the spot, picked up the survivors who had not had time to perish.

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LOANS AVAILABLE TO WORLD WAR VETS

(Associated Press Leased Wire)

World war veterans desiring to borrow on their adjusted compensation certificates can secure loans in three to five days from the Portland office of the United States Veterans' Bureau. Any certificate that has been issued two years has a loan value. The bulk of the certificates are dated January 1, 1925, and these certificates have a loan value of approximately 22½ per cent of their face value.

Veterans who have borrowed on their certificates can secure new loans for the present loan value if desired. Some veterans borrowed through banks in the past, did not redeem their certificates and they were sent to the veterans' bureau at Washington, D. C. Additional loans can be secured by sending notes to Washington. Notes can be secured from Roy Young, service officer of Uniqua post, No. 16, American Legion, who will be glad to give any information about these loans.
