LOWRY EXPLAINS WHY ALL SINNERS FAIL TO BE SAVED

At the Lowry meeting last night, there was a solo by Mr. Frank Grubbe, of Wilbur, and a duet by Mr. Raymond O. Nelson and Mr. Grubbe. Miss Slouch, with her usual skill, was the accompanist. The large attendance at the afternoon services continues to be a feature of the campaign.

Prayer meetings are to be held in the homes tomorrow morning at 9:30. Tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 the evangelist will deal with the Devil, and in the evening he will speak on the second coming of Christ. Saturday evening he will give his sermon on the home.

Right before the invitation was extended for the first time, and 17 persons have come forward. The topic of the evangelist last night was, "Why All Men Are Not Saved," and the text was these words found in John 5:40, "And ye will not come to me, that ye might have life."

These words contain one of the saddest utterances that ever fell from the lips of our Savior. How sad it is, how strange it is, that so few are being saved when all might be saved if they would. Sinners are lost not by reason of anything in Jesus Christ, but by reason of something in themselves. They will not come to Christ that they might have life. There are two things that stand out on the pages of the Bible so plain that everyone can read them. The one is that if any sinner is saved, God's will be the glory; the other is that if any sinner is lost, the sinner's will be all the blame.

"The death of Jesus Christ took the sin of the world out of the way so that a clear way to God and pardon and life was opened for all. He died for all. The ransom price has been paid for all. He tasted death for every man. So, then, Christ is sufficient to save all. But there has never been a soul saved outside the redemption accomplished by Jesus Christ, and, more, there never will be one saved in any other way. Those who were saved before He came were saved through faith in the Redeemer to come. Jesus said, 'I am the way, the truth and the life; no man cometh unto the Father but by me.' So, then, Jesus is able to save all men, if all men would come to him for salvation."

"Sinners are lost, not because Christ is unwilling to save all. The whole Bible shows that Jesus is willing and anxious to save all sinners if they would come to him. 2 Peter 3:9, 'The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness, but is long suffering to usward, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. Then hear His heart-rending cry after the lost in Ezekiel 33:11, 'Say unto them, as I live, saith the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his wicked way and live. Turn ye, turn ye from your evil way; for why will ye die? Unsaved friend, if you finally sink down to hell and are lost forever, it will not be because of any unwillingness in the heart of Jesus Christ, but because of something in yourself.'

"Many do not come to Christ because the gospel is utter foolishness to them. 1 Cor. 1:23, 'We preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews a stumbling-block, and unto the Gentiles foolishness, yes, to the unsaved it appears a foolish scheme. That a man may enter heaven by his own good works, they are willing to believe, for this is agreeable to the pride of the natural, unregenerate heart. But to trust in the righteousness of another is foolishness to the unsaved. But if it is foolishness with you, it is because you are willing to have it so, for the devil cannot enter your heart without your consent, and Jesus Christ never will. You are what you are, and just because you want to be no better and no worse. You are not accepting Jesus Christ for one of two reasons, either because of what He would bring into your life, or because of what He would cast out. It costs something to be a Christian."

"Others do not come to Christ for salvation because they are not willing to humble themselves. In other words they are ashamed of the gospel. Every man would like

to be saved, but he does not want to be saved in God's way. If every one could be saved in his own way there would be as many ways of salvation as there are different individuals. I had nothing to do with the making of the plan of salvation, but it is my duty to proclaim it. You cannot dictate any terms of salvation to God. It is God's way or hell for the last one of you. You can't fool God into believing you are humble, when you are not willing to come out and confess Christ. The biggest fool on earth is the man who thinks he can fool God Almighty. His terms of salvation are simple, and easy enough for every one to understand. He says in Romans 10:9-10, 'That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved, for with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.' If you would be saved, there must be that time in your life and experience when by a definite act of faith you accept Christ into your heart and confess Him with your mouth. That is plain enough for any man to understand. Many do not accept Christ because they love their sins. Gal. 1:4, 'Who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of our God and our Father.' The trouble with many is that they do not want to be delivered. They love their sins."

THE WOMEN'S CHRIST OF THE ANDES

"President-elect Hoover, while in Chile, was invited to see one of the world's most remarkable monuments.
"In 1902, Chile and Argentina were making great preparations to go to war over a boundary dispute. Chiefly through the efforts of the women and the clergy, they were persuaded to settle the question by arbitration instead. The money thus saved was used for better roads and harbors. Part of it built the great Trans-Andean railway that connects Santiago with Buenos Aires.
"The women of the two countries, led by Señora Angela de Oliveira Cesar de Costa of Argentina, raised the money for a colossal statue of Jesus Christ, made of bronze obtained by melting down old cannon taken from Spain in the War of Independence. It was set up at the highest accessible point on the disputed boundary.
"The day before its dedication, hundreds of persons from both countries toiled up the mountains, to be on hand for the unveiling. They traveled joyously, the Chileans camped overnight on the Argentine side of the boundary, the Argentines on the Chilean side. In the morning, after hymns and prayers, the statue was unveiled amid a burst of music, with salvoes of cannon, and great rejoicings."—Alice Stone Blackwell.
