

EUROPEAN SCALE MAKES APPEARANCE IN FRUIT REGIONS

A new insect pest, lecanium or European fruit scale, has made its appearance in Douglas county, and will require close attention to prevent serious losses, according to J. C. Leedy, county agent and J. Ireland Parker, county fruit inspector.

The disease has been found in the Middle and Myrtle Creek sections and is likely to spread quite rapidly.

The insects are light yellow in color when young, turning to a reddish-brown, later. They are about one-eighth of an inch long. They winter in a half-grown stage on branches of prune, pear, apricot or other trees, maturing in April or May, when large numbers of eggs are laid. When hatched, the young settle upon the leaves and young twigs, where they remain during the summer. There is but one brood a year. The species is exceedingly prolific and the insects are often so thick as to entirely cover all of the smaller twigs.

Control measures are directed against the immature winter forms which occur on the new growth of prunes or other trees. Mistletoe, if possible, should be removed. It is recommended by Don C. Mote, entomologist at the Oregon experiment station, application to be made in the dormant season, before the buds start to burst. The exact time for spraying will vary with the season, from late January to early March.

Thoroughness of application is essential to success. As the scales are formed largely on the terminal growth it is comparatively easy to fail to thoroughly cover this part of the tree. Poor coverage will result in poor control.

The above suggested oil spray may take the place of the usual dormant spray, but where more control is desired, a flourescent oil spray, using 8 pounds of bluestone and 5 pounds of delhydrated lime.
