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LOWRY DEFENDS GENESIS AGAINST EVOLUTION THEORY

various parts of the city this morning at 9:30. This afternoon, Dr. Lowry spoke on the "Creation Versus Evolution." The subject for this evening will be "The Pleasures of Sin" or the gospel side of the popular amusement question. Tomorrow night he will speak on the "Great Judgment" and Mr. Nelson will sing a solo entitled, "I Dreamed That the Great Judgment Day Had Dawned." Plans are being made for four great services next Sunday, and there will be a meeting for men only at 2:30 in the afternoon, and at the same hour a meeting for women led by Miss Mildred Slough.

In speaking on the subject of "Creation" this afternoon, Dr. Lowry based his remarks upon this trustworthiness and absolute authenticity of the first chapter of Genesis. He spoke in part as follows:

"Genesis means, Book of Beginnings. In the Genesis we have the beginning of the universe and the earth, the beginning of plant and animal life, the beginning of human life, the beginning of sin, in its relation to man, not the beginning of sin in the universe. The beginning of redemption and the beginning of God's self-revelation. Genesis is the granite rock upon which stand all the construction of the New Testament as well as the Old. It is quoted 60 times in the New Testament. Jesus Christ was constantly appealing to Genesis in His teachings. He never expressed a doubt as to its divine origin. But Jesus showed that one could not believe on Him for salvation who did not believe Genesis. In John 1:16-17 we read, 'For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote to me. But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe my words?' Many weaklings in these days seem willing to give up Genesis, hoping thereby to hold the balance of the Scriptures. There never was a more dangerous or foolish thought. The whole Bible either stands or falls with Genesis. If the Bible is not reliable when it speaks of natural things, it could not be trusted when it speaks of the spiritual and supernatural things. The man who does not believe the Bible regarding creation, cannot believe it for redemption and salvation, and he who thinks he can be living under a great delusion. So you see how impossible it is for an evolutionist to be a Christian. You say 'I am a Christian evolutionist.' Well you might just as well talk about a heavenly devil there isn't no such animal. Paul calls them fools in Romans 1:21-22, 'Because that when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their own imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened. Professing themselves to be wise they became fools.'

"No wonder then that evolution and modernism is turning out a generation of criminals. You teach young people that they are beasts and they are going to live like beasts. No wonder that crime has increased 500 per cent in this country in 30 years. It was about that long ago that men in the pulpits and in our educational institutions began to advocate and put forth this theory of evolution. No wonder that 30 young people in our colleges and universities in this country committed suicide the first three months of 1927. Of course, if God is not our creator we are under no obligations to obey Him and the natural outcome is a general throwing off of all moral responsibility and restraint as a consequence.

No Apology for Genesis "But there need be no apology for Genesis. There is not a more up to date book in the world today than Genesis. It has never been found in conflict with any known scientific fact of nature or science, and this I say without fear of contradiction on the part of any pulpits and in our educational institutions. It is often found in conflict with so-called science. Evolution is not science, it is a guess pure and simple. The word gener-

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ally used is 'hypothesis,' which is the 'high-brow' word for 'I guess.' True science, as everyone must admit is 'Absolute knowledge of certain known principles and facts.' Even Darwin admitted that evolution was an unproven theory, and a theory is not science.

The Original Creation

"Much of the misunderstanding of the first chapter of Genesis is due to the fact that many have never learned to distinguish between the original creation and the six-days restoration. All we have said of the original creation in the first and second chapters of Genesis is in the first verse, 'In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.' When that was we do not know. Then we see by the second verse that the earth became a wreck some time afterward. 'And the earth became desolate and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep.' The earth as represented in the second verse is as a battle field the next day after battle. Then in the balance of the first two chapters of Genesis we have the account of the six-days restoration, when the world was fitted for the habitation of man. According to this account this was done in six days of 24 hours each. We do not have the word translated 'create' used in the balance of these two chapters except in the case of creation of animal and human life, that is the life principal. In the other case we find God is making or forming something out of that which already exists, for we find that the earth, the waters and all other material already existed at the time of the six-days restoration. There is room between the original creative act of God in the beginning and the reformation of the earth for all those geological changes asked for by the geologist. Those who attack Genesis on geological grounds simply expose their own ignorance of the real teachings of the Bible. God being the creator of nature and the Bible, His books must agree, and they do agree and as I stated at the beginning, nature is never found in conflict with the teachings of the Bible. The greatest difficulty is that men formulate some theory and then go to the Bible to substantiate it. If they find it does not agree with their theories they declare the Bible to be in error. But true scientists are ready to hold with the late Sir Wm. Dawson, who was president of the great university in Toronto, 'I know nothing of the origin of man except what I am told in the Bible, that is that God created him. I do not know anything more than that, and I do not know of any one who does.'

The Bible clearly teaches that the earth was originally created perfect and beautiful. Eccl. 3:11. 'He hath made everything beautiful in His time.' God distinctly declares in Isaiah 45:18, that He did not create it waste but to be inhabited. 'For thus saith Jehovah that created the heavens: he is God that formed the earth and made it, he established it, he created it not waste, he formed it to be inhabited.' Here in this verse we have all three words brought in and it no doubt refers both to the original creation and also to the six days restoration. This verse is the key to a proper understanding of Genesis chapters one and two.

Then in nature we have no evidence of anything having been created a chaos. It is incredible that the Infinite Artist of the universe should have created in artistic chaos and confusion. In spite of the blight of sin, everything the earth produces is perfect and beautiful. The leaf, the tree, the flower, and how impossible for man to complete any so beautiful as the rose. He cannot even produce his beautiful colorings in a painting. Beauty, correct proportions and harmony of parts, are everywhere in evidence. What must this old world have been like when it came fresh from the creative hand of God, and before it was wrecked as explained in the second verse, 'And the earth became desolate and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep.'

According to the Scriptures, this old world will be destroyed once more, and that by fire, but for us who are saved and in Christ Jesus there will be a new earth: 'Looking for and hastening unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat. Nevertheless, we according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness. Wherefore, beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be diligent that ye may be found of him in peace, without spot and blameless.' (2 Pet. 3:12-13.)

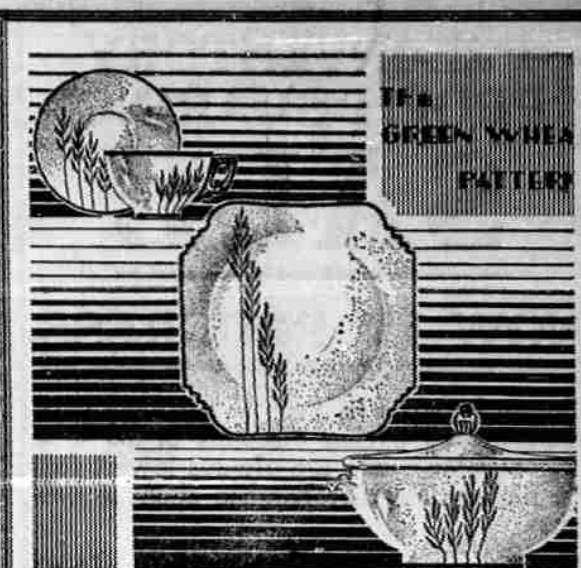
