tion on the part of the members of the choir and their faithful attendance. An opportunity was given in both the morning and evening services for the people to make a free will offering to the Moody Bible Institute in appreciation of the services of the evangelistic party which came to Roseburg under the auspices of that institution. The people responded liberally and on behalf of the Moody Institute Mr. Lowry thanked them for their hearty support of the work of that institution, which is supported by contributions from people all over the world.

The evangelistic party left on the Santa this afternoon, and will make train connections at Portland, expecting to reach Chicago Thursday morning. They will again take up their work at the Moody Institute.

**Growth in Grace**  
In speaking to the new converts and young Christians on Sunday morning, Mr. Lowry chose for his text, 2 Peter 3:18, "But grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever, Amen."

My theme this morning is, Growing in Grace. The Christian life is a growth. We do not grow into grace, and you, but we grow in grace. We are born into the Kingdom of God through faith, then we are expected to grow and develop. Just as Paul said, "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling," but he did not say, "Work for your salvation." There is a vast difference between the two. We are expected to work out that which has been planted in our hearts by the Holy Spirit.

We are commanded of God to grow in grace, because God can never be satisfied with anything short of our very best. God is perfectly satisfied with you the moment you made an unconditional surrender to Him, but He certainly could not be satisfied to find you six months or a year hence, just where you are now. He expects you to be found growing and developing in grace and the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ, just as we expect to see a normal child grow and develop physically.

**The Essentials**  
Now in the first place I want to call attention to some things that are absolutely essential if you are to make a success of the Christian life, and first I would say, Trust only in Jesus Christ for salvation and be sure you are saved. I John 5:13, "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life." Said it is the faith, but He certainly does not have assurance, that is, they are not able to say they know their sins are forgiven and that they are saved. Why is this true of so many? I believe that with the majority it is because they are not trusting in the finished work of Jesus Christ, but in what they themselves do.

If you are to live a joyous Christian life you must remember that you are as completely pardoned in the moment of believing as you will ever be. You are as certainly forgiven when born again as you ever shall be. The forgiveness of sin is not a matter of degrees or of growth. Acts 13:39, "And by him all things are justified from all things from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses." The moment I accepted Jesus Christ, God's word declares that I was justified from all things. I have been living the Christian life from that day to this. Am I any more justified here and now than I was then? Certainly not. I was justified then, how? By faith. I am justified now, how? By faith. Well then, what have my works in the meantime had to do with my justification? Absolutely nothing. I work because I am saved, and not with the hopes of being saved. "Well," you say, "Mr. Lowry, won't the Christian live right and do good work?" Most certainly. But he does that out of love to Christ be-

cause he is saved. Gal. 5:6, "For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth anything, nor uncircumcision, but faith which worketh by love." Wherever and whenever you find saving faith, you are going to find an outward manifestation of it in holy living and works of righteousness. Where these things are absent, it is evident that that individual has never been truly born of God. Jas. 2:14 and 17, "What doth it profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? Can that faith save him? Even so, faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone."

**Join Church of Choice**  
Join the church of your choice and confess Jesus Christ in baptism. Acts 2:47, "And the Lord added to the church day by day those that were being saved." We don't join the church to be saved, but because we are saved, and desire to be associated with the people of God. If I should hear of any of you new converts refusing to join the church, I wouldn't expect to hear anything good of you in a short time. Many have tried to live the Christian life without joining the church, but I never heard of any one that made a success of it. I do not believe it is possible for any man or woman to live a true Christian life outside the church. I have yet to see the first person that had even the first principle of being a Christian who was refusing to unite with the church. The only thing above ground and under the stars that represents Jesus Christ is the church. If it had not been for the church in its various branches you see I would have never heard of Jesus Christ, or have seen a copy of the Bible. How, then, could you be a Christian and refuse to fellowship with God's people? You say, "What church shall I join?" I would say, "Join the church where you personally can get the most good, and where you can do the most good."

**Read the Bible**  
Feed on the word of God. In our text Peter tells us to grow in grace and the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. In his first epistle the second chapter and second verse, he tells us how to do it. "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby." You can no more grow spiritually without proper food and nourishment than you could physically. The Bible is different from any other book in the world. It is to the spiritual man just what food is to the physical man. Jesus said in Matt. 4:4, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." Make it a habit of your life to read a portion of scripture every day. Acts 17:11, "These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so." Though you may find it necessary to rise a little earlier every morning, you cannot afford to neglect the reading of God's word every day. Ten minutes a day, that seems little enough time, yet in a year that would be six days of 10 hours each. Even that is enough to make you a fairly good Bible student in a year or two. Then not only read the Bible, but memorize it. Ps. 119:11, "Thy word have I hid in my heart, that I might not sin against thee." One of the greatest mistakes I made when I first became a Christian was in neglecting to memorize the Scriptures. Second to my conversion, I consider that the greatest blessing that ever came to my life, came to me when I began to memorize the God's word. I have naturally a very poor memory, and I do not believe anyone here this evening could find it more difficult to memorize than what I did at the beginning. But I was determined to do it. I saw that I was making no real progress in the Christian life without it. I was not able to help others for I did not know how to use the Bible in leading men to Christ. We have many men and women who can preach to great crowds, but they do not know how to lead souls to Christ, for they do not know their Bibles.

**A Praying Christian**  
Then I would suggest that you begin every day with prayer. Isa. 40:31, "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." Talk to God in the morning before you talk to man. Win the victory over temptation before you face with God. When temptation comes, as it surely will, don't try to fight it in your own strength, but look to Jesus to give you the victory. A gentleman with large business interests and many cares and responsibilities was noticed by another never to get out of fix, or lose his temper. He never seemed to become ruffled. The other man was so impressed by it that he asked him for the secret of his life. "Well," said the man, "if you would know the secret of my life, I am a Christian. Every morning as I take my hat from the rack I always pray a little prayer. 'Oh, Lord, make me master of all that is under my hat today.' That is a great prayer. When we win the victory over our sinful inclinations, we have won the greatest victory that was ever won in this world. Paul said in I Thess. 5:17, 'Pray without ceasing.' Pray about your work, pray about your business, about your studies, and about your home cares."

**Christian Work**  
Take up some definite line of Christian work. A little boy was asked why he had not been baptized. He answered by saying, "I presume, I answered to sleep too near where I got in." Many people fall out of the church for the same reason. They go to sleep too near where they get in. Go into the church determined that you will do your share of the work. Don't be a drone in the House of God.

Pay as you pray. New converts go into the church determined to pay their part. Don't be a pauper in the house of God. I am a fir believer in tithing, and I find that thousands of others of God's people have found this a most blessed way to gauge their Christian giving. Lev. 23:32, "All the tithes of the land, whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree is the Lord's, it is holy unto the Lord. And all the tithes of the stock and of the herd, whatsoever passeth under the rod, tenth shall be holy unto the Lord." God claims the tithes as belonging absolutely unto himself. It never belonged to you and never can, and when you spend it upon yourself, you are robbing God. John Wesley's motto was, "Make all you can, save all you can, give all you can." Don't wait for the church treasurer to come around and dun you for a subscription, but go look him up and tell him what you propose to do. Begin with so much a week, and as the Lord prospers you increase the amount.

**Some Don'ts**  
Next, I would like to call your attention to a few things that you are not to do, if you expect to be found growing in grace. First, do not permit known or wilful sin in your life. Often we see those who make a bright start in the Christian life, but soon fall by the wayside. Why is that? Well, if we could get at the root of the matter, we would find that it was because they refused to surrender some known sin. I have talked to thousands of men and women who had made a start in the Christian life and turned back, and without exception no one as I have been able to learn, they all acknowledged that it was because they held on to some known sin. You cannot be a Christian and hold on to sin. You might just as well understand that right here in the beginning. It is either a whole Christ or no Christ. You either crown Him Lord of all or you do not.
